TIME FOR HIS HONOR TO ACT HAS SURELY ARRIVED

Montreal Herald Comment on the New Brunswick Political Situation---An Attempt Being Made to Thwart the Will of The People---The Laurier Government Went Out Two Weeks After Election.

The Montreal Herald publishes the following editorial on the situation in New Brunswick under the heading of "The People's Will Defied."

Four weeks ago the people of New Brunswick emphasized the verdict they rendered on the previous Saturday by electing four more Liberals to the legislature of the province. By this act, the popular will wiped out the government of the Hon. James A. Murray, which had followed that of the Hon. George J. Clarke, which itself succeeded the notorious Flemming regime. Under democratic government the will of the people is supreme, but there have been during the last few weeks, indications that attempts were being made in New Brunswick to thwart the people's will. Mr. Murray has not yet resigned and New Brunswick is still in the power of a moribund government.

It is correct constitutional usage to allow the members of a defeated government sufficient time to set their house in order and make a graceful exit. When Sir Wilfrid Laurier's ministry was defeated at the polls on the 21st of September, 1911, Sir Wilfrid's resignation was in the hands of the Governor General on Oct. 6th, fifteen days later.

In the New Brunswick case twice fifteen days have elapsed, and still the

Tory government hangs on to power like grim death. And to add to the scandal, some of the newspapers supporting Mr. Murray are urging him to cling to power in spite of the verdict of February 24.

It is within the memory of many of us how, in 1896, Sir Charles Tupper, defeated at the polls, tried to fill every vacancy in the Senate and every office of emolument before giving up the reins of power to Sir Wilfrid Laurier, and how Lord Aberdeen, the Governor General, was obliged to interfere and insist upon common decency being observed. And even Tupper gave up on the thirty-fifth day after his defeat.

Fortunately, there is in New Brunswick a power above the swirl of party strife. The Hon. Josiah Wood is lieutenant governor of the province. He has an unblemished reputation. He can be depended upon to act in the best interests of the province in which he represents the crown. The time for His Honor to act has surely arrived. If Mr. Murray refuses or neglects to hand him his resignation, there is but one course open to the Lieutenant Governor under our system of government. That course is to ask the prime minister for his resignation without any further delay. Knowing the Hon. Mr. Wood's fine sense of public duty, we do not for a moment imagine he will shirk the responsibility.

Over thirty names were secured last night for Class A members (those who have returned from France, etc.) and the list is being kept open until next Monday evening's meeting, when an election of officers will be held.

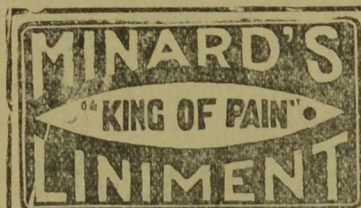
Following this meeting, there will be a public meeting, when the aims and objects of the new association will be presented looking to public support so that a club house or home may be established for the returned veterans.

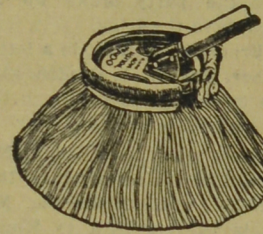
