PRESERVING CARROTS.

Canned Carrots.
Select firm carrots of an even size. Scrub with vegetable brush and immerse in scalding hot water long enough to loosen skin. Dip in cold water and remove the skin. If carrots are small, pack whole; if large, cut in quarters. Pack in jars, adding one teaspoonful of salt to each quart jar. Place jars in rack in boiler and fill to overflowing with boiling water. Adjust rubbers and covers, but do not fasten the latter securely. Put sufficient warm water in boiler to cover tops of jars. Cover boiler and sterilize ninety minutes from the time water in boiler reaches boiling point. Remove jars from boiler and tighten the covers. As most vegetables packed in glass jars darken if exposed to the light, it is well to wrap the jars in paper before storing.

Carrot Conserve.

Wash and scrape carrots and cut into small pieces. To each quart of carrots allow two and one-quarter cups of sugar and the grated rind and juice of a large lemon. Boil carrots until they are tender and the water almost evaporated. Remove carrots and melt the sugar in the remaining water and the lemon juice. Add the carrots and cook until syrup thickens. Turn into glasses and seal.

Sweet Pickled Carrots.

Select medium-sized carrots, wash and scrape. Cut in quarters and boil in salt water until tender. Drain and plunge into cold water. In a porcelain lined kettle put one pint of vinegar, two large cups of sugar, one scant teaspoon each of ground cloves and cinnamon. Boil for one-half hour and add carrots. Boil for another fifteen minutes. Put in jars and seal.

BAKED APPLES WITH RAISINS.

Wash and core a sufficient number of apples and fill the cavities with chopped raisins mixed with a few chopped nuts. Place in a dish and sprinkle with granulated sugar. Half fill the pan with cold water and bake in a slow oven. The juice in the pan

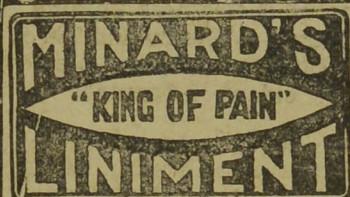
should be served as a sauce with the apples.

PARSNIP CAKES.

Parsnip cakes are made from parsnips cooked tender and mashed and then mixed with a beaten egg; add enough flour to hold it together. Then form into small cakes and brown on both sides in dripping or butter.

CELERY SAUCE.

This is to be used with leftover chicken, veal or lamb, which can be cut in dice and heated in the sauce. To make it, mince celery enough to measure half a cupful and add it to a cupful of white sauce.

MANY USES FOR PAPER

London, Sept. 30. — "Paper string is being used for commercial purposes everywhere now," says a report of the Board of Trade. "Even tissue paper can be used in its manufacture. With regard to textiles, paper is being used for making sacks for commercial use in place of burlap, and these have been found to equal the former sacks in every way."

Paper shoes are being manufactured on a small scale in England, the paper being used for the uppers. The material is plaited paper closely woven, somewhat similar to that used in the manufacture of paper hats. Paper fibre is also used in making a cheap grade of imitation felt hats for men.
