Partial List of Victims Of the Halifax Disaster

The Catastrophe One of the Worst in the History of the Continent—Twenty Girls Working in One Establishment Reported Dead—Hundreds Are Still Missing—Many Miraculous Escapes—Many Harrowing Tales.

Halifax, Dec. 7. — So far as is known the matron at the Protestant Orphanage and all the children in her care, save one or two, have perished. Of the two who escaped, one was in the building at the time. The other was not. The child who was in the building says that when the explosion came Knaut called to the children to come to the basement with her. Evidently she thought that a bomb had fallen from the air.

Thirty girls employed at the Richmond Printing Company are all reported dead.

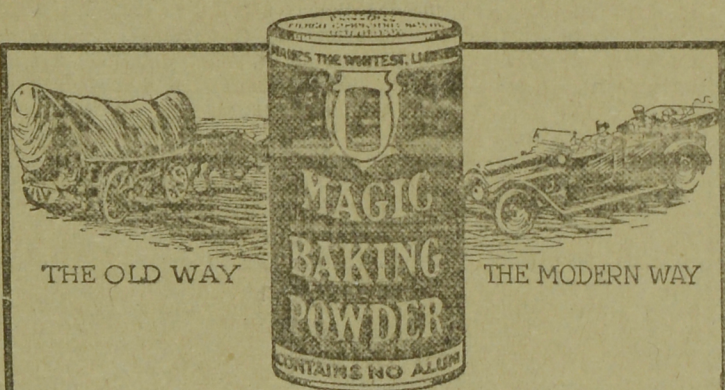
