

Apple Sauce Cake.

Two cups flour.  
One cup sugar.  
One-half cup butter or butter sub-  
stitute.

One cup apple sauce, unsweetened.  
One cup chopped raisins.  
One teaspoonful cinnamon.  
One-half teaspoonful cloves.  
One-quarter teaspoonful salt.

Method: Apple sauce must be dry  
baked apple put through sieve or un-  
peeled apple steamed. Cream but-  
ter, all sugar and spices. Sift flour  
over raisins, add soda to apple sauce.  
Add to sugar and fat. Then add flour  
and raisins and beat thoroughly. Bake  
in buttered and floured pan 1-1-4  
hours in moderate oven. Very light  
and nice. The above recipe costs 29  
cents and has been tested by Mrs.  
Robin Cropley.

Buckwheat Cookies.

One and three-quarter cups buck-  
wheat, one cup sugar, half cup of fat,  
butter or lard, two eggs, one level tsp.  
cinnamon, half tsp. cloves.

Method—Beat egg, add sugar, melt-  
ed fat and beat until thoroughly mix-  
ed. Sift dry ingredients and add very  
slowly. Roll on floured board. Shape,  
bake in greased pans ten minutes.

This recipe costs 27c., and has been  
tested by Mrs. J. J. F. Winslow.

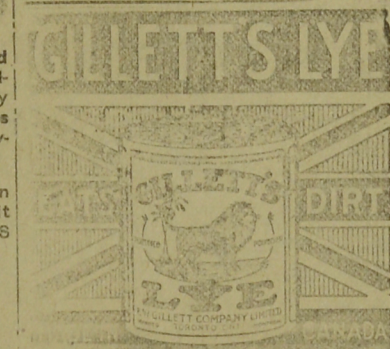
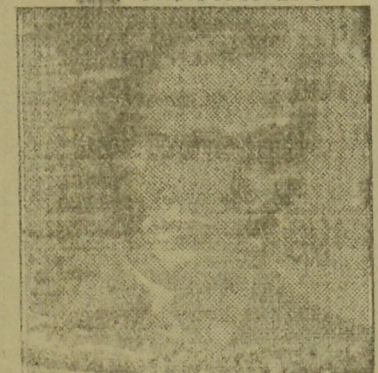

BRAN MUFFINS.

Mix two cupfuls of bran, one cupful  
of flour, one-half teaspoonful of salt,  
one teaspoonful of soda, one-half cupful  
of molasses, one and three-quarters  
cupfuls of milk and one tablespoonful  
of melted shortening. Beat all very  
well and bake for 25 minutes in a  
moderate oven.

Potato Omelet.

Add one cup of dice potatoes,  
boiled, to an omelet made of three  
well beaten eggs, and season with  
salt and pepper. Ad a little minced  
parsley. Fold and serve.
