account under the 40 per cent. arrangement, but nothing had been charged up for interest on the Valley Railway bonds. It was not good business to go on charging up the interest on these bonds to construction account. That was another reason why there should be some revision in the system of bookkeeping. Had proper entries been made in the books as they should have been the charges for interest would have appeared there.

The government had estimated what they thought the amounts would be, but the auditors said that they must not place those charges in ordinary accounts; at the same time they must not conceal it. In due course when the railway is transferred to the Dominion government they will probably ask for a refund of the amount already paid. Another instance of peculiar bookkeeping was the account owing since 1913 to Newsome and Gilbert of Montreal. The account was originally some \$6,000 some of which had been paid and some had been carried over and was still outstanding and the Montreal firm was still claiming about \$500. There was nothing to show why the delay was caused and the government would have to do the best they could to clear the matter up.

He did not think that sufficient attention had been given to place the claims of the province properly before the Dominion government. The time had arrived when the Dominion government should take over and com-

plete the Valley railway. In recent years that government had been giving away large tracts of land in western Canada in which this province had just as great an interest as any other province. Quebec, Ontario and Manitoba had hundreds of thousands of acres of extra territory given to them and this province had got nothing whatever in compensation to make up for it. No one appeared to be troubling about this province's interests with the result that New Brunswick was left out in the cold and considering that it was the friends of the late government who have been in power at Ottawa and had the disposal of the matter it might have at least been expected that the late government would have bestirred themselves in the province's interest. The present government would certainly do what they could to try and secure something for this province yet if it was not too late.

Turning to the estimates of the present year the government had to take things as they found them and they would carry on the business practically under the direction of the old government for the balance of the current year. It was impossible to make any changes, at this late date. They would make the best of conditions as they found them, but they could certainly assume no responsibility.

It would be noticed that the estimated expenditure was some \$148,576 in excess of the estimate of receipts. This was caused from various reasons. The estimated cut of lumber this year was considerably less than of late years

tion of the crown lands but had not done so and no one could look back on the record of the eight years without a feeling of regret. He had strong hopes that in the years to come that the government would receive a large increase of revenue from crown lands which would be very useful in wiping out the deficits they now had to face. He did not wish to be regarded as pessimistic but he felt that the people were entitled to the truth in regard to provincial finances. Knowing the truth he was confident that they would rise to the occasion and provide the revenue necessary to carry on the business of the country. There should be no stopping now, the province must go ahead. Improved highways are needed and the administration has already made a forward movement in this respect. The darkest hour was always before the dawn and he believed the people could look forward to the future with hope and confidence. He would move, seconded by Hon. Mr. Foster, that the House resolve itself into Committee of Supply.

Mr. Baxter moved the adjournment of the debate which was made the order of the day for 3 p. m. tomorrow.
