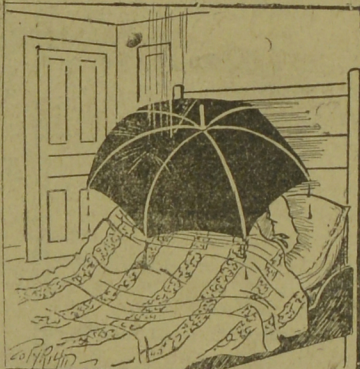

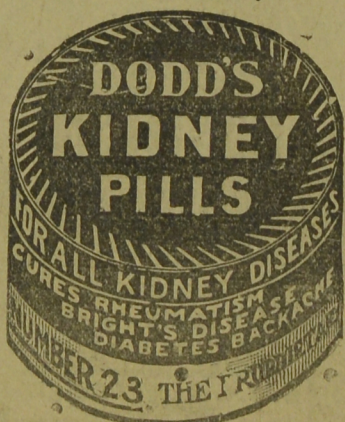

CARPENTIER
HAS WONDERFUL
RING HISTORY

French Aviator Now in United States Began to Box When He Was Only Thirteen Years Old.

Georges Carpentier, now in America, has had a great record. Only twenty-three years of age, Carpentier has been boxing since he was thirteen years of age. A slightly built lad, then, weighing less than 160 pounds, he amazed all by his wonderful boxing cleverness. Hardly a week passed but what he boxed in Paris and in a very short time he installed himself as a prime favorite with Parisians. English boxers who were taken over to meet him had a great respect for the Frenchman's prowess. Unlike other boxers, as he put on weight, he improved his boxing knowledge. As a fly-weight he was good, winning the title at that class; as a bantam he was better, defeating all at his weight; the same occurred in the featherweight class, while as a lightweight he had no peer. It was then that he began to loom up as a world's champion prospect. One after another he handily defeated Young Nipper, Jack Meekins, George Randall, Frank Loughry, Sid Stagg, Jack Goldswain, Sid Burns, Arthur Evenden, all boxers of the first water. He won the European welterweight title by beating Young Josephs, the English champion, in ten rounds, and was acclaimed the world's champion when he bested the famous Harry Lewis in twenty rounds.

Defeat by Piet.
Henri Piet, the French welter, handed Georges a beating in ten rounds, but this did not dismay Carpentier, and after a little rest he beat Battling Lacroix, the French middleweight champion, and then won the European title at that weight by knocking out Jim Sullivan in two rounds. Defeats at the hands of Frank Klaus, Billy Papke and Joe Jeanette, showed up the Frenchman a little, but he came right back and beat Pat O'Keefe, Gunboat Smith, Kid Jackson, Bombardier Wells twice, thereby winning the European heavyweight title. Jeff Smith, George Gunther and numerous others. Then he entered the big fight and has been doing herculean work ever since. Lithe as a panther, quick as lightning, resembling more a student than a boxer, with a hefty kick in each hand, Carpentier today ranks as one of the best boxers in the world. It remains to be seen whether his inactivity in the roped arena, owing to his military prowess, has assuaged him up, but on his past reputation Georges Carpentier stands alone. He worked up from a fly-weight to a light-heavyweight, winning a championship in every class, a unique performance.
