

## SOME ECONOMICAL RECIPES FOR COOKING.

Baked Haddock.  
1 haddock, 1 onion, 1 carrot, 1 cup flour, 1 cup milk, 1 cup butter, 1 cup salt.

Two pounds haddock, 2 cups dry bread, 1 teaspoonful grated carrot, 3 teaspoonfuls fat, 1 onion sprinkling of flour, salt and pepper, 3 teaspoonfuls grated onion, 1-2 teaspoonful salt, 1-2 teaspoonful pepper, 1-2 carrot.

Wash the haddock and wipe dry. Sprinkle with salt and pepper. Stuff the fish with the mixture of dry bread, grated onion and carrot, seasoned. Slice one onion over it, also one-half carrot. Sprinkle with a little flour and put in the oven with a teacup of cold water and let bake three-quarters of an hour.

## APPEAL FROM OPPOSITION CANDIDATES

To the Men of York.

Gentlemen,—Having been unanimously chosen at a large convention to oppose the candidates of the present government in this county, we submit ourselves to the electorate and ask for support. The convention at which we were chosen did not represent one political party only, but was composed in large measure of men who in the past supported the present administration, but who have resolved to follow in this election the dictates of conscience rather than party and who have made up their minds that they cannot, by supporting the candidates of the government approve of wrong doing.

The administration in charge of the affairs of this province since 1912 has been convicted of the gravest wrong doing. The Hon. J. K. Flemming while Premier was found guilty of stamping with his approval the collecting of large sums for grossly improper purposes from the holders of Crown land licenses. The Hon. J. A. Murray, the Premier, supported in the Legislature a resolution expressing approval of this conduct of Mr. Flemming after a Royal Commission appointed by this government had found him guilty; and now the same Mr. Murray, in the manifesto which he has issued to the people of the Province, brazenly states that he will, if elected, attempt to follow in the same footsteps.

WE APPEAL TO YOU TO VOTE AGAINST SUCH GROSS DISHONEST PRACTICES. We also appeal to you upon the platform of reform adopted by the Opposition in provincial convention in January, 1916. The present government has since the adoption and publication of that platform, attempted to follow to some extent a few of its provisions. One of the planks of this platform was the adoption of province-wide prohibition of the sale of intoxicating liquors; another was that the taxes levied on automobiles should be used for the construction of permanent roads.

The Hon. B. F. Smith has lately appropriated to his own use part of this plank concerning the use of automobile taxes and the Legislature has since the adoption of the Opposition platform passed a Prohibition Act. That statute was therefore passed with the approval of both the Government and the Opposition. There is now nothing required to be done except the enforcing of the act, and we assure you that if elected we will not lend support to any measure tending to weaken its effect, and we will provide for its proper administration.

It will be impossible for us to see personally a very large number of the electors, between now and election day. The government has decided to hold the present elections on the shortest possible notice and in the dead of winter, when the roads are blocked with snow and many of the men and women are away from their homes. There is only one explanation for this, namely, that the Government fears to have the light of public discussion thrown upon its nefarious transactions. Although we cannot see you all, we assure you that if elected, we will devote our best energies to the best interests of the county and the province. We are yours very truly,

To Mr. John A. Young, Taymouth.

Dear Sir,—You have been nominated as a candidate at a convention held in the city of Fredericton on Thursday, the 8th inst., to contest the County of York at the election of February 24th. Associated with you as a ticket are the names of Mr. James K. Pinder, Dr. Wm. C. Crockett and Mr. S. B. Hunter. I am surprised to see Mr. James K. Pinder's name associated with yours on a ticket asking the electors of the county of York for their votes and support, after the villainous attack you made upon your neighbor, friend and colleague, the same Mr. J. K. Pinder, in a public place in Boiestown, at the time a vacant seat in the Legislature was being contested by Col. Guthrie and Mr. James M. Scott. You there and then, in the past office at Boiestown, in my presence and in my hearing, said of Pinder was a liar and thief.

Now, Mr. Young, in fairness to you, I may say you were talking politics, for you went on to say that "Pinder, by lying and deception, tried to obtain and did obtain from the Government \$2,000 per mile additional bona guarantee for his railway."
