LONGEST ON RECORD

R. Carter Appointed County Auditor---

The Municipal Council of York County ended its session Saturday afternoon after the longest sitting on record. The Council sat five days last week and in January one day, making six days in all. The lengthy session was necessary on account of the chaotic condition of the county's finances as the result of the death of the late secretary-treasurer.

On Saturday afternoon R. Carter was appointed county auditor at the salary of \$200 per year.

In preparation for the enactment of a Provincial Prohibition Act, the salary of Scott Act inspector Timmins was ordered to be discontinued after May 1st.

CONFERRED BY CZAR
ON U.N.B. GRADUATE

The man so honored is Lieut. Burdette W. Harmon, who while a sapper in the Canadian Engineers won the Distinguished Conduct Medal. Since that time he has been commissioned as a Lieutenant in the infantry.

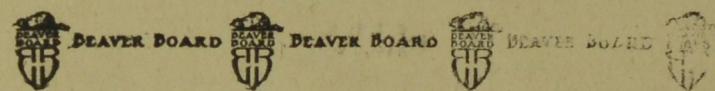

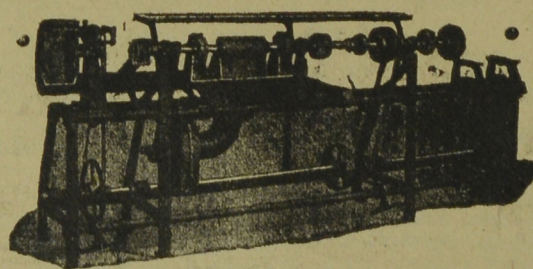
