RUSSIAN EXILES CAN PASS THROUGH GERMANY

Copenhagen, via London, April 19.-The German government has granted permission to a second delegation of Russian exiles to return to Russia from Switzerland. This time fifteen social revolutionists of the extreme radical type will be repatriated. The earlier delegation were social democrats of a milder persuasion. The fifteen exiles are headed by Nathanson, who next to Prince Kropotkin is the oldest Russian revolutionist of prominence.

Nathanson was one of the leaders in the original revolutionary party of "The People's Will," while Kropotkin was a Nihilist, Nathanson and his colleagues are extreme peace apostles.





TOU'VE met at least one of those few good old souls, who are constantly getting the worst of it when shopping, who don't believe in advertising.
