tenegro. There is one tragedy which I am sure we shall not have and that is the tragedy of the United States.

"By countless conversations with leading Americans I know that unless there is swift improvement in our methods here the United States will rightly take into its own hands the entire management of a great part of the war. It will not sacrifice its blood and treasure to the incompetent handling of the affairs of Europe.

"In saying this, which is very much on my mind, I believe, I have none but the most friendly feeling toward yourself and that I am greatly honored by your suggestion.

City of Fredericton
Board of HealthNotice of Compulsory
Vaccination.

The Fredericton Board of Health, District No. 1, having been ordered by the Provincial Board of Health, under the provisions of Section 39 of the Public Health Act 1911 to enforce compulsory vaccination for smallpox, all residents of the City of Fredericton, over the age of four (4) years, who have not been vaccinated within 5 years of November 1st, 1917, must be vaccinated on or before Friday, the 30th day of November next, unless physically unfit, and submitting the Certificate of a duly qualified physician to that effect.

This Board has decided that instead of dividing the City into Districts and assigning a physician to a particular district, they will allow each physician to vaccinate any resident of the city who may request him so to do. Residents of the City can therefore choose their own physician to perform the service, which will be free of any charge to them.

Any persons refusing or neglecting to obey the above order, on or before Friday, the 30th day of November, 1917, will subject themselves to the provisions and penalties of Rules Numbers 40, 41 and 42 of the Public Health Act 1911.

The parent or guardian having the charge or custody of any minor under the age of sixteen years will be held responsible for the proper observance of this Order.

Important Meeting

Department of Agriculture and Representatives of County Councils to Meet in Fredericton, Tuesday, November 20th.

The serious situation in the Allied Food Supply has forced definite and immediate action upon the people of New Brunswick. The production of food next year must now be considered and definite arrangements for seed made. Transportation difficulties make it imperative that all supplies move eastward at an early date. The problem is rapidly growing and to meet this properly the Department has decided to discuss the matter with representatives of the County Councils. Premier Foster and the Hon. J. F. Tweeddale will be present.

Every Council has been communicated with and it is expected that three members of every Council will attend.
