## ECONOMICAL RECIPES FOR COOKING.

## Salmon Loaf.

Mix one can of salmon with 4 heaping tablespoons bread crumbs and 2 beaten eggs, using a silver fork, season with 2 tablespoons butter, and salt and pepper. Pack in a buttered baking dish and bake 45 minutes. Serve with an egg sauce, or garnish with slices of lemon and cucumber pickles.

## Tuna Fish with Rice.

Heat one can of tuna, fish in boiling water before it is opened. Heat one cup of rice. Thicken one cupful of milk with 2 tablespoonfuls of butter rubbed into 2 tablespoonfuls of flour. Remove the hot fish from the can and place in the center of a platter, surround it with the boiled rice and pour the white sauce over the fish. Garnish with celery, parsley, hard boiled eggs, or olives.

## Lobster Chowder.

Mix one large can lobster with

2 cooked potatoes cut in dice, 2 slices salt pork cut in squares, 1 slice onion, and 1 cupful cold water. Boil 5 minutes, add 4 cupfuls milk, season with salt and paprika, thicken with 2 tablespoons of butter rubbed into 3 tablespoonfuls of flour and add 4 or 5 split crackers before serving.

## Sardine Sandwiches.

Remove the skin and bones from sardines. Rub the yolks of 3 hard boiled eggs to a paste with the fish. Season with lemon juice, salt and cayenne pepper, moisten with olive oil. Spread on lettuce leaves between thin slices of buttered bread.

To the Men of York.

Gentlemen,—Having been unanimously chosen at a large convention to oppose the candidates of the present government in this county, we submit ourselves to the electorate and ask for support. The convention at which we were chosen did not represent one political party only, but was composed in large measure of men who in the past supported the present administration, but who have resolved to follow in this election the dictates of conscience rather than party and who have made up their minds that they cannot, by supporting the candidates of the government approve of wrong doing.

The administration in charge of the affairs of this province since 1912 has been convicted of the gravest wrong doing. The Hon. J. K. Flemming while Premier was found guilty of stamping with his approval the collecting of large sums for grossly improper purposes from the holders of Crown land licenses. The Hon. J. A. Murray, the Premier, supported in the Legislature a resolution expressing approval of this conduct of Mr. Flemming after a Royal Commission appointed by this government had found him guilty; and now the same Mr. Murray, in the manifesto which he has issued to the people of the Province, brazenly states that he will, if elected, attempt to follow in the same footsteps.

WE APPEAL TO YOU TO VOTE AGAINST SUCH GROSS DISHONEST PRACTICES. We also appeal to you upon the platform of reform adopted by the Opposition in provincial convention in January, 1916. The present government has since the adoption and publication of that platform, attempted to follow to some extent a few of its provisions. One of the planks of this platform was the adoption of province-wide prohibition of the sale of intoxicating liquors; another was that the taxes levied on automobiles should be used for the construction of permanent roads.

The Hon. B. F. Smith has lately appropriated to his own use part of this plank concerning the use of automobile taxes and the Legislature has since the adoption of the Opposition platform passed a Prohibition Act. That statute was therefore passed with the approval of both the Government and the Opposition. There is now nothing required to be done except the enforcing of the act, and we assure you that if elected we will not lend support to any measure tending to weaken its effect, and we will provide for its proper administration.

It will be impossible for us to see personally a very large number of the electors between now and election day. The government has decided to hold the present elections on the shortest possible notice and in the dead of winter, when the roads are blocked with snow and many of the men are away from their homes. There is only one explanation for this, namely, that the Government fears to have the light of public discussion thrown upon its nefarious transactions. Although we cannot see you all, we assure you that if elected we will devote our best energies to the best interests of the county and the province. We are

GRAFT REVELATIONS A  
DISGRACE TO PROVINCE

Commenting on the report of the Royal Commission which investigated the Dugal charges, the Quebec Chronicle, a leading Conservative paper, said:

"The terrible revelations of official graft in New Brunswick are a disgrace not only to that Province, but to all Canada. They almost completely destroy public confidence in the honesty of our public men, and unquestionably inspire grave doubts as to the possibility of ever securing anything like an upright administration of public affairs under our present system. Yet no administration ever came into office with more pious professions of high virtue and devotion to the public weal than did the Flemming government of New Brunswick. On the strength of these it literally swept the Province at the last general election in 1912, only two members being returned to support the Opposition.

"There is no longer the shadow of a doubt that loot was the object for which the men now in charge of the government of the Sister Province down by the sea sought office. Their conduct of public affairs was dishonest from the start, and today, under their manipulation, no province in Canada has been so betrayed, so shamed and so degraded as New Brunswick by these same men, who have played in the most heartless manner upon the good faith, the loyalty and the patriotism of their people in order that they might scatter the contents of the treasury among themselves and their 'followers.'

We have the leaders still in power. Turn them out!
