NATIONAL EXECUTIVE I.O.D.E. MUST SETTLE DIFFICULTY

Fredericton Officers in Provincial Chapter Refused to Serve Because Mrs. VanWart Was Not Elected.

The Provincial Chapter, Imperial Order of Daughters of the Empire, closed its annual meeting at 8.30 last night with a deadlock over the election of officers. It is probable that another meeting will be held to unravel the tangle.

The delegates from the primary chapters of St. John were numerous enough to control the meeting, and when the result of the balloting was announced it was found that Mrs. G. Clowes VanWart of this city, for seventeen years president of the chapter, was not re-elected. The Fredericton ladies who were elected to office declined to act when they learned that the president had been removed by the St. John votes. The Countess of Ashburnham, who was elected president in place of Mrs. VanWart, declined to take office.

Reference to National Executive. It is stated today that the matter will be referred to the National Executive, which meets at Toronto for a ruling on the matter in order to settle the difficulty.

Balloting was a very slow process, account of the number of delegates present, and the afternoon session, which began at 2.30, did not close until 8.30, giving the St. John delegates barely enough time to catch their train.


A despatch from Athens said that the resignation of the Greek cabinet was impending.

EARLY MORNING FIRE DOES CONSIDERABLE DAMAGE

Dwelling Owned by Mrs. Annie Massie of St. John--Two Other Small Fires.

The dwelling house in George street occupied by Mr. Percy Duncan and other tenants and owned by Mrs. Annie Massie, of St. John, was considerably damaged by fire between two and three o'clock this morning. The fire originated from hot ashes and broke out in the rear of the building. The loss is covered by insurance.

The ell of the building was badly gutted and loss in the main house was caused by smoke. The blaze was large and aroused many citizens who thought the fire was more serious than it was. The firemen had an hour's work on the fire. Damage to the extent of about \$500 was done.

The fire department was called to the residence of Mr. Oliver Smith, George street, last evening, about six o'clock, for a small fire on the roof. The damage was slight.

At 12.30 this afternoon there was a small fire at the dwelling in George street occupied by Messrs. F. W. Emms and Allan Delong and owned by Mr. Harry C. Mackay. There was little damage.

Toronto, April 19.—Alex. F. MacLaren, Conservative member for South Perth, in the House of Commons from 1898 to 1906, died in the general hospital this morning aged 63. For the past two years he had for the greater part of the time been confined to the house. Mr. MacLaren was well known as a cheese manufacturers.


