

ROUND SOFA PILLOWS.

Are Vying With Favorite Square Ones for Present Popularity.

Round and oblong sofa pillows are vying with the long favorite square ones in popularity these days. And these offer many opportunities for using up a small piece of beautiful figured material, by combining it with a plain color that harmonizes. Many attractive circular cushions have a comparatively small disk of brocade, or embroidery or some other beautiful figured material in the centre, while the intervening space is covered with a plain material, shirred on a cord at intervals of two or three inches.

Several of the newest oblong cushions are finished off with a plain seam on the long sides, but the ends of the cover are allowed to extend two or three inches beyond the pillow, and are treated as a scant ruffle which has the effect of drawing in the ends slightly to give a somewhat oval appearance. These are very attractive and easily made. Some such cushion covers in flowered cretonnes would be pretty bits of furnishing for the summer cottage at seashore or country.

The ends could be fitted with drawstrings so that the covers, made like ordinary pillow cases, except that they are open at both ends, could be washed and ironed easily.

RICE PANCAKES.

Sift 2½ cupfuls of flour with 4 teaspoonfuls of baking powder, 2 tablespoonfuls of sugar and ½ teaspoonful of salt. Add ¾ cupful of hot cooked rice, 1½ cupfuls of milk, 1 beaten egg and 2 tablespoonfuls of melted butter. Bake on well greased griddles.

MACARONI AU GRATIN.

Break ¼ lb. of macaronia into short lengths, plunge into boiling salted water and cook 25 minutes. Drain, and throw into cold water to blanch for ten minutes. Drain well, and put a layer into a well buttered baking dish. Add a layer of grated cheese, then more macaroni, then more cheese, until the ingredients are all used. Have a sprinkling of grated cheese and buttered bread crumbs on top, fill the dish with milk, and bake thirty minutes. Serve in the baking dish.

WALTER JOHNSON

GOOD FOR EIGHT YEARS

MORE IN BIG LEAGUE

Opened Present Season With Shutout
---Appears to Have Every Pitching Ability He Had in His Youth.

Walter Johnson began his eleventh major league season with a shut-out, attached to three hostile hits.

Judging from those who saw him work, the Idaho Shrapnel has as much speed today as he had ten years ago. This seems reasonable enough, despite reports that Johnson was slipping a bit.

The Washington star is not only a pitcher with rare physical power, but he has one of the easiest pitching motions ever known. There isn't a jerk or a kink in his delivery. The whole affair is a matter of perfect rhythm, and this means, as a rule, unusual length of service.

Johnson is now only 29 years old. As he takes the best care of himself and rarely worries under fire, he should have at least eight years more.

MAINE SHIP YARDS

WILL BE BOOMING

Portland, Me., April 17.—No limit will be placed on the number of merchant ships to be constructed in Maine yards for the United States shipping board emergency fleet corporation, organized at Washington today, according to William H. Hand, the naval architect, who arrived here today to inspect shipbuilding plants or sites in this state.

Portland business men, it was learned, are considering plans to provide capital to equip a dozen or more Maine shipyards, which have been idle for many years, and place them in shape to turn out as many wooden ships as possible for the fleet which is to carry foodstuffs and munitions to the Allies. Acting under orders from the immigration authorities at Washington, Timothy Elliott, chief immigration inspector here, began to register the names and addresses of all shipbuilding carpenters in the state or other men capable of engaging in shipbuilding.

JOHNNY DUNDEE HAD EASY WIN FROM MEALY

Philadelphia, April 16.—Johnny Dundee, of New York, had every minute his own way in the 18 rounds he engaged in with Johnny Mealy tonight at the Olympia A. C. The latter was very tired at the finish. Dundee floored Mealy with a left-hand swing flush on the mouth early in the first round.

THOROUGHBRED STALLION KILLED ANOTHER IN FIGHT

Louisville, Ky., April 16.—Free Lance, by Imp Alvecot, out of Merryheart, winner of the Latonia Derby in 1912, was killed in a fight with Ralph, another thoroughbred at Bashford Manor the home of George J. Lang, his owner, near here, yesterday.

Mr. Lang, it is said, had refused \$20,000 for the animal, which, according to horsemen, easily was the champion 3-year-old in his derby winning year.

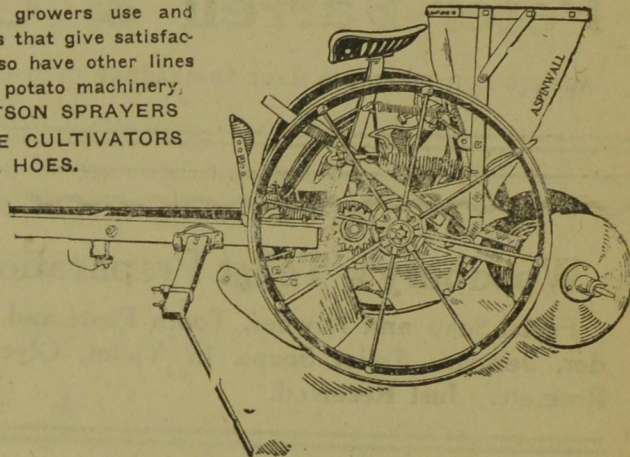
