BIG LINER LAURENTIC SUNK BY A MINE

Was One of the Largest and Finest Steamships Afloat--Was an Auxiliary Cruiser.

London, Jan. 29.—The British auxiliary cruiser Laurentic, of 14,892 tons gross, has been sunk by a submarine or as a result of striking a mine, according to an official statement issued tonight by the British Admiralty.

Twelve officers and 109 men were rescued. The Admiralty statement adds that the vessel went down off the Irish coast last Thursday.

The commander of the Laurentic, Capt. Reginald Norton, is among the survivors. He was appointed about six months ago to the command of the steamer, which was commissioned for patrol service in November, 1914.

Just before being taken over by the British Admiralty for auxiliary cruiser duty, the Laurentic was in the Canadian service of the White Star and Dominion line. The vessel was owned by the Ocean Steam Navigation Co., of Liverpool. In the first two years of the war the Laurentic was engaged in doing patrol duty in the far east, but several months ago returned to European waters.

Marked Epoch in Shipping.

The launching of the Laurentic at Belfast in 1908 marked the entry of the White Star line into the Canadian trade. The vessel was said to be the first passenger steamer to be fitted with a combination of reciprocation engines with a low pressure turbine. At that time the Laurentic was the largest vessel in the Canadian trade. She was 555 feet long, with a beam of 67 feet. In addition to accommodation for 150 first class, 430 second class and 650 third class passengers, she was equipped with six cargo holds, with large refrigerating chambers. The Laurentic was a sister ship of the Megantic, another ship in the Canadian service which was requisitioned by the British Admiralty.

VETERAN OF SEVERAL NAVAL ACTIONS JOINS 236TH

Aubrey C. Curtis, a native of Cardiff, Wales, was taken on the strength of the 236th Highlanders here this morning. He enlisted yesterday at St. John after a journey of 400 miles from the Maine lumber woods, of which he covered 75 miles on foot. Another man from the old country accompanied him, but failed to pass the medical examination at St. John.

Curtis already is a veteran of the war, having served at Liege, Antwerp, the bombardment of Heligoland, the German Gulf, the defence of the Suez Canal and the Dardanelles. As a memento of the landing at the Dardanelles, he has a scar on the top of his head made by shrapnel. This wound he received April 25th, 1915, and was not discharged from hospital until March 23rd, 1916.

His service was with the British navy, in which he served twelve years

APPEALED TO VILEST PASSIONS OF THE HEART

Sir Wilfrid Laurier's Stiff Rejoinder To the Speech of a Tory Member.

Ottawa, Jan. 29.—Dr. J. W. Edwards, Conservative member for Frontenac, resumed the debate on the address in Parliament today. He expressed himself as being delighted with the Dorchester by-election, and intimated that he had no horror of the Conservative-Nationalist Alliance. He described as "a good omen" a result which defeated a candidate who had the endorsement of the Liberal leader.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier rose. "I never repudiated Mr. Seigny for taking the attitude he has taken in this house," he observed. "What I repudiated him for—what I blame him for—is for attempting in the province of Quebec to stir up the people, as he did with the Nationalists, against taking any part in the wars of Great Britain. He obtained his mandate in that election (1911) by appealing to the vilest passions of the human heart."

Vigorous speeches in condemnation of the government were delivered by Mr. George W. Kye, of Richmond, and Hon. Charles Murphy. The latter expressed surprise that the Premier had not placed before the country the reasons which led to the retirement of Sir Sam Hughes.
