GOOD HOUSEKEEPING HINTS.

Here are Ideas, Dropped Casually at a Knitting Party That May be of Utmost Value.

Use oilcloth to make inner coverings for porch pillows, use wash materials for the outside covers, and save the bother of worrying about them every time it rains.

Before curtains are put into the wash tub, fasten them to the stretcher to find out their exact size, then mark the hframes with an indelible pencil, writing "parlor," or "bedroom" or "dining room" to identify the marks. This will save lots of time and worry in the way of adjusting the frames each time the curtains are washed.

Saw off the legs of a fine new kitchen table for a nursery or child's bedroom. This makes a much more solid piece of furniture than is the ordinary low table sold for children's use. It can be painted any color, and decorated with Mother Goose motifs.

When tailored suits get shiny from wear, wet a thin piece of muslin in witch hazel, spread it on the shiny section, mould a hot iron over it until it steams, then press the goods on the wrong side.

To save the paint in a partially emptied can, pour on a thick cover of melted paraffin.

Patch a broken place in the plaster of a room with a paste made by mixing one part of white flour with two parts of sand and two parts of sifted coal ashes and water. This cement will outlast the original plaster.

Do not cut off half an inch from the sewing machine band when it stretches and becomes too loose to fit the wheel. Put a few drops of pure castor oil on the band and run the machine for a few minutes and the band will swell and tighten.

A heated lemon is said to yield more juice than a cold one. Wash, sugar

and dry lemon peel for flavoring fruit cakes, and making puddings and mince pies. Clean aluminum with lemon skins.

The vinegar from home-made pickles is better than ordinary vinegar for making salad dressing.

A piece of old stocking tied over a whisk broom makes the best of stove cleaners.

GERMANY'S EXCUSE FOR SUB PIRACY

London, Sept. 18. — The Chronicle in a leading editorial under the head, "Despotism doomed," says: "In Germany just now evidently by preconcerted arrangement, resolutions are being passed by all sorts of organizations attacking the American president for his scathing attacks on autocratic power in Germany which planned this war, and in its prosecution has 'tossed up' no bar either of law or mercy." This tremendous indictment of the Kaiser and his entourage made a deep impression in Germany. Hence these inspired resolutions of protest; the Kaiser's message published today, and Hindenburg's contemptuous allusion to the American president. These engineered German protests against President Wilson's powerful indictment, prove that the Kaiser, his juniors and the military caste know the stream is against them."
