UNION TYPOS PASS STRONG RESOLUTION

At the recent convention of the International Typographical Union, the following resolution setting forth the position of the union printers, was unanimously endorsed:

"Whereas, the United States and Canada have entered the world war on the side of democracy as against autocracy and militarism, and have pledged all their resources of manhood and wealth to the prosecution of the conflict to the end that ultimate victory shall bring to the world and all its people the full and free enjoyment and advantages of man's true birthright, that of self-government, and the undisputed exercise of the right to associate himself freely with his fellows in the achievement of all good purposes under that birthright, denying to none the privileges and immunities he claims for himself; therefore, be it

"Resolved, that the International Typographical Union pledges its unswerving support to the President of the United States in his efforts to maintain the dignity and preserve the honor of the United States in all its relations with the world, and to secure the safety of all its citizens at home and abroad in the peaceful pursuit of their lawful business, and to insist upon the careful observance of all obligations and requirements of treaties and agreements solemnly entered into covering the rights of American citizens wherever they may be found."

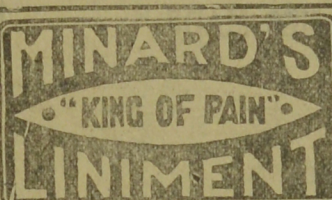
Classes meet twice a week for two hours. Term lasts 10 weeks. Only a limited number of applications can be received.

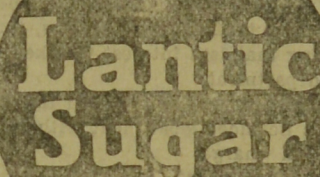
