## Citron Pudding.

Wash one-half pound of butter in two waters or until free from salt; add 1 pound of sugar and cream them together until very light. Beat the yolks of 8 eggs until pale and stiff, and add the mto the butter and sugar, then grate in the rind of half a lemon. Line pudding pans with rich pastry, shave a cup of citron very thin over the bottom and put in the pudding  $\frac{3}{4}$  of an inch deep. Bake in a moderate oven, increasing the heat as the batter rises. Try with a straw, and when the batter leaves the straw clean, it is done—or when it stops singing.

Baked in a deeper dish than this, and without any citron, it is called "Chess Cake" and is delicious.

## Cocoanut Pudding.

Peel and grate two medium-sized cocoanuts. Cream together 4 ounces of fresh butter and 1 pound of sugar until light. Then stir in 1 pint of cream and the well-beaten whites of 8 eggs. Housekeepers should make the citron pudding above and the cocoanut pudding about the same time. Flavor with the grated yellow rind of lemon or es-

sence of lemon, then stir in the grated cocoanut. Bake in patty-pans lined with puff paste.

## Chocolate Whipped Cream.

Melt a half-square of chocolate over boiling water and add  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup of boiling water and 3 tablespoons of sugar. Cook until smooth and add half a teaspoonful of vanilla. Whip half a cup of heavy cream and when partly thickened, gradually whip in the chocolate mixture and continue to whip until stiff to the bottom of the bowl. Serve with plain cake.

## Pineapple Charlotte.

Soften and stir until dissolved  $1\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoons of powdered gelatine in the juice from half a small can of pineapple. Cut up the pineapple fruit and cut up half a cup marshmallows into small pieces, and mix them together; then add them to the gelatine, fold in 1 pint of whipped cream, toss up lightly and serve in a bowl lined with lady fingers, or in individual glasses with a cherry on top of each.

## Sporting News

CLEVELAND SPENT  
MOST MONEY IN 1916  
FOR NEW PLAYERS

Chicago Cubs the Money-Spenders of National League--Washington Cancelled Draft and Spent Nothing

According to the official report of the National Commission, the Cleveland club spent the most money for players purchased in the year 1916, while the Washington club spent the least in the American League. Jim Dunn parted with \$33,100 for minor leaguers and may have to cough up \$8,000 more, if certain players are retained. This does not include the \$50,000 paid for Speaker, the \$5,000 for Gandil or the money paid for Daly and Howard.

The Washington club cancelled its drafts, the Old Fox losing the players he wanted, and so spent nothing for draft. Purchased players cost the club \$8,550 and \$5,700 must yet be paid out if the bushers make good and are kept.

The White Sox run second to the Indians, with an expenditure of \$24,400 and \$13,600 yet to be paid. Then comes the Athletics with \$19,775 and \$7,050 additional, if the players contracted for are retained.

Detroit spent 14,500 and \$10,000 additional, the Yankees \$13,400 and \$6,000 additional, Boston \$12,200 and \$3,600 additional and St. Louis \$9,250 and \$11,200 additional.

For drafted players the Athletics spent \$8,900; St. Louis \$5,200, Chicago and New York each \$3,450, Cleveland \$2,700 and Detroit \$2,000.

In the National League the Cubs spent \$95,300 and \$24,600 additional for purchased players, and \$5,450 for drafted players, leading the circuit. The Reds, Giants and Pirates follow after in money spent, with the Phillies bringing up the rear.

American League clubs spent a total of \$130,725 for players purchased, with an additional \$66,650 to be paid if all players bought are retained. National League clubs paid \$109,700 for purchases, with \$70,050 more to be paid if all players bought are retained.

In addition to these sums the American League clubs paid a total of \$24,700 for players drafted while the National League clubs paid a total of \$37,500 for drafted players.

In the sums in cash paid for purchased players, moreover, no account of players given in part payment is taken, yet players worth in the baseball market thousands of dollars were turned over to the minors as part of the sales agreements.

TWIN RUNNERS SHOW  
MARKED SIMILARITIES

It is a remarkable thing that twins should carry their similarities into mile running, as have the Shields twins. E. M. Shields, the Penn. freshman, holds the world's interscholastic mile record of 4m. 23 3-5 sec., made last spring, and now they tell us that the brother, who is at Penn. State, ran a mile trial last week in 4m. 24s. It would be difficult to produce a parallel case of twins in sport.

GIANTS RELEASE CATCHER  
TO LOUISVILLE CLUB

Louisville, April 26.—Catcher Brad Kocher has been released by the New York Nationals to the Louisville American Association baseball club as a final payment in the trade whereby pitcher James Middleton was traded last year. Kocher played with Toronto in the International League in 1915.

## KELLY AND MACK DRAW

North Adams, April 26.—"Harlem Eddie" Kelly of New York and Frankie Mack of Beaumont, fought a 12-round draw here tonight. Nearly every round was evenly fought, with both boys mixing hard and fast from start to finish. George Kid Rosch, of Bennington, Vt., stopped Rube Lundy of New York in the fifth round. Young Mahoney and Patsey Fay, both of this city, boxed a four-round draw.

Bert Gove has bought the pacer Flashing, .144, of Dan King, "Doc," who has half a dozen head at Speedway, will train the horse.

INVASION OF TRACKS  
IN QUEBEC BY NOVA  
SCOTIANS MAY BE OFF

Classes on Several of Tracks do Not Suit Prospective Invaders—Len Acker Talks on Situation.

According to the Sydney Record, the Nova Scotia horsemen who were threatening to invade Quebec tracks during the early racing season, will not go at all unless certain tracks alter their classes to suit them. Len Acker, of Halifax, is the Record's authority for the statement that twelve horses promised the Quebec tracks by Pat Doherty, of Sydney, and Peter Carroll and Len Acker of Halifax will not be shipped unless Valleyfield, Sherbrooke, Three Rivers and Quebec City change the 2.16 pace and 2.22 pace to 2.15 and 2.18.

## Acker's Stable.

Concerning Len Acker's stable, the Record says:

"Mr. Acker will campaign this season what he declares to be the finest stable ever owned by him. He will race three new ones imported from the United States since last season. King Okla, 2.11 $\frac{1}{4}$ ; My Conolel, 2.16, and Jennie Frisco, 2.14 $\frac{1}{4}$ . The first named will be started in the free-for-all and Mr. Acker expects him to clean up the others in this section. "Jennie Frisco is the finest race horse I ever owned," he told the writer, "and I believe she will race in 2.10 if called upon to do so."

"He purchased Jennie Frisco last spring in New York. She is five years old and has a mark of 2.14 $\frac{1}{4}$  and is by San Francisco, one of the greatest of all sires and out of a Walnut Hal mare. My Colonel raced on the Bay State Circuit in Massachusetts last season with more or less success."

Fitchburg, April 26.—Chick West, of Holyoke, was given the popular decision in his ten-round bout with Walter Butler of Revere before the Cleghorn, A. C. tonight. West had the better of all the rounds. In the eight-round bout between Oliver of Holyoke and Chip Murphy of this city, the former was awarded the decision of the crowd.

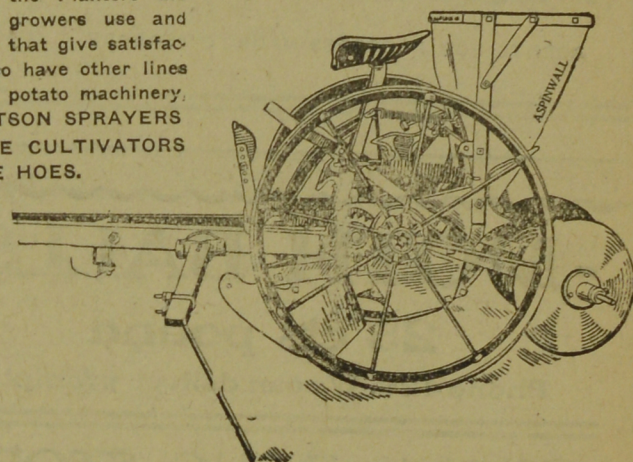
