VICTORIA REPEATED ON FRIDAY AT BANGOR FAIR RACES, WINNING 2.19 TROT IN FOUR GOOD HEATS

Sussex Mare Was Only Fifth in First Heat, But Won Next Three Heats—Best Time was 2.15 1/4—Africander Took First Heat—Bangor Horse Belgrad, Heavy Favorite, Went Lame.

Victoria, the Sussex mare owned by Dr. D. H. McAllister, repeated at Bangor Fair, winning the 2.19 Trot on Friday last. Again the New Brunswick mare failed to make a showing in the first heat but won the next three.

The Bangor News says: There was considerable local interest in this race as the big rangy stallion Belgrad, the only Bangor horse on the track for the afternoon, driven by Ralph Burrill, showed up well in the first heat and looked good. He had the pole and showed the way the most of the way around until Walker sent Africander to the lead on the last turn and won out in a good drive to the wire.

Africander looked good for the race upon his first heat form with Belgrad drawn as he showed lame. But horse-racing is uncertain. In the second heat the Canadian mare Victoria and Buster Richardson's slick little mare Barb Cord dashed to the pole ahead of Africander on the first turn and held the lead well around, Walker shaking out Africander but hadn't the speed to get by, although he forced Victoria to the fastest mile of the race and beat out Buster to the wire.

Victoria made a skip on the first turn in the third heat letting Baron Sidnut into the lead, but the mare settled down and had the stuff to head the Baron on the last turn and came down to the wire riding easy. In the final heat Victoria took a safe lead and held it. Interest centered in the scrap for second between Barb Cord and Baron Sidnut and Buster grinned with satisfaction when he beat out the Braon.

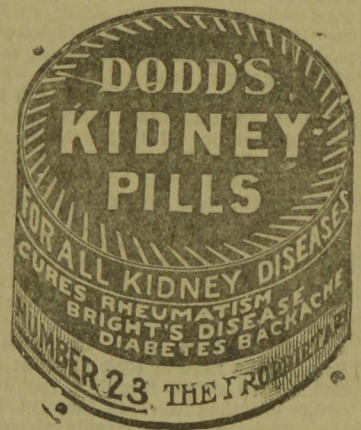
JAS. W. MCKINNEY WON AT CHATHAM

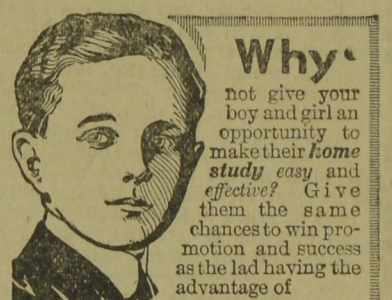
Maine Horses Figured in the Money in Majority of the Races—Some Close Finishes.

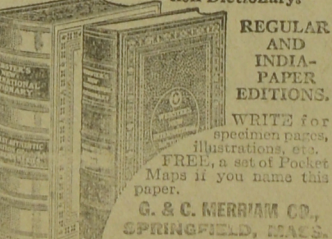
