

Fixing the Valve Stem A bent valve stem on an automobile maine invariably will cause trouble by ticking open and thus causing misfir-ing of the cylinder in which it is oper-sting. In testing for a bent stem, which hardly is noticeable to the eye, place the valve in its guide and with the forefinger gently lift the stem. It should move freely and drop back to normal position of its own weight. If it does not, clean the stem and guide and try again. If the stem and guide are clean the former may be bent.






