RECEPTION IN HONOR OF THE NEW BAPTIST MINISTER

Congregation of Brunswick Street Baptist Church Heartily Welcomes the Rev. Mr. Warren---Addresses by Revs. J. E. Wilson, J.J. Colter, H. C. Archer and Others---An Appropriate Reply by the Pastor.

Rev. Gordon C. Warren, the new pastor of the Brunswick Street Baptist Church, was inducted last evening in the presence of a large gathering of members of the congregation. Prior to the induction ceremony, which took place in the main auditorium of the church, an informal reception was held in the vestry. Chancellor and Mrs. Jones and Mr. and Mrs. W. G. Clark received with Pastor and Mrs. Warren, and introduced the members of the congregation.

Mr. J. W. Spurden presided at the induction ceremony and stated that it was a matter of regret at inability to attend had been received from Rev. Dean Neales, Rev. Canon Cowie, Rev. Dr. Kierstead, Rev. Thos. Marshall, Rev. W. W. Wilson and Rev. J. S. Sutherland. The latter expressed the hope that Rev. Mr. Warren's pastorate would be crowned with success, and felt sure that he would find the people here sympathetic and hospitable.

The First Speaker.

Rev. J. E. Wilson, of the George St. Baptist Church, was introduced as the first speaker. He spoke of the ministerial changes that had occurred in Fredericton during his residence here and remarked that he was the second senior pastor, Rev. Canon Cowie being the first. He told of the good fellowship which existed among the different pastors and went on to say that when one was lost another came to take his place. He remarked that he was pleased to welcome Mr. Warren as a Nova Scotian, but Mr. Warren interrupted to say that he was a native of Prince Edward Island. Rev. Mr. Wilson, proceeding, said that the churches of the city were indebted to Nova Scotia for a number of pastors. Rev. Dr. MacDonald was a Nova Scotian, so were Rev. Mr. Newcomb, Rev. Dr. Smith and Rev. Mr. Archer, and he (Wilson) claimed Nova Scotia as his birthplace. He mentioned the fact that a number of New Brunswickers were now filling pastorates in the sister province and he believed that the interchange was a good thing for the church. On behalf of the Baptists of New Brunswick and the church of which he was the pastor, he cordially welcomed Rev. Mr. Wilson to Fredericton.

Rev. J. J. Colter.

Rev. J. J. Colter was next called upon, and welcomed Mr. Warren to Fredericton on behalf of the Methodist church. He wished him every success and hoped that the congregation would prosper under his able leadership.

Miss Eva Brewer at this stage rendered a solo in her usual charming manner.

Rev. H. C. Archer.

Rev. Mr. Archer, pastor of the Reformed Baptist Church, was the next speaker. He said that on behalf of his people he was glad to unite in welcoming Rev. Mr. Warren to Fredericton, and trusted that he would be a blessing to the Brunswick Street Baptist congregation and that they would be a blessing to him.

A male quartette composed of Messrs. Cooper, Holder, McLean and Dryden rendered a selection which was much enjoyed.

Mr. R. B. Wallace.

Mr. R. B. Wallace, clerk of the church, cordially welcomed the new pastor and his family on behalf of the church and congregation. He said that the call had been a unanimous one and all were pleased when he had accepted it.

The Pastor's Reply.

Rev. Mr. Warren replied in a brief but eloquent address. He expressed appreciation of the kind words that had been spoken of him. He went on to say that although his last pastorate was in Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island was his birthplace, his better half was a New Brunswicker and their child a Nova Scotian. This complication made it little difficult for him to tell just where he stood. He looked forward with great pleasure to his pastorate in Fredericton and felt sure he would enjoy the fellowship of the other pastors. He had received a Christmas present last year in the shape of a call to the pastorate of this church, and as he could not wait until next Christmas to reply, he had forwarded his acceptance as a New Year's gift. He felt that he was assuming a great responsibility, and if he had not felt sure that he would receive the hearty co-operation of the members of

the church, they would now be welcoming some other man as their pastor. He thanked them for their hearty welcome and trusted that God's blessing would rest upon one and all.

The proceedings were brought to a close by the national anthem and the benediction pronounced by the pastor.

An adjournment was then made to the vestry, where ice cream and cake were served by a committee of the ladies.
