New York, March 5.—After listening to an address by Theodore Roosevelt, the citizens of Oyster Bay, at a mass meeting last night decided to "adopt" a Belgian village of 2,400 children. The plan will call for a contribution of \$2,400 a month.

## CONTEST IN CIVIC ELECTION ON MONDAY, MARCH 12TH

Oliver T. Smith For Mayor and E. S. Horncastle For Alderman in Wellington Ward, Nominated as Labor Candidates --- Mayor Mitchell and Ald. Judson Barker the Opposing Candidates --- Ex-Mayor Hooper Ready in Case Mr. Smith Withdraw

As was announced in Monday's Mail, Oliver T. Smith is opposing His Worship Mayor Mitchell for the mayoralty, and Mr. E. S. Horncastle is opposing Ald. Judson Barker for alderman in Wellington Ward. These new nominations were made late yesterday afternoon. Both nominees are employees of the John Palmer Company, Limited, and are running as Labor candidates. Their opponents have the support of the Good Government Association. Ex-Mayor W. S. Hooper was to be nominated in the event of Mr. Smith deciding not to run.

The nomination of Mr. Smith causes a curious complication, as he is a prominent member of the Good Government Association and was present at the meeting of that Association on Saturday night last at which four aldermanic candidates were endorsed. He gave no intimation at that time that he would be a mayoralty candidate. It is understood that he gave his consent to nomination yesterday afternoon.

By Acclamation.

Let us see what the much abused Acadians did on the other side. It is said and claimed by every Tory orator and newspaper that the Liberals were swept into power by the Acadian vote, and that in that fact there lies some menace to the province. It is an accident, a mere coincidence at the poll. But let that pass. How did the Acadians stand on the question of toleration? In Moncton, city a Tory claims that he was defeated by the Acadian vote, but what did the Acadians do? They helped to elect a Methodist to the Legislature, who, unlike the Tory, is prominent in the work of his church and has held some of the highest positions as a layman within its gift. We have not heard an Acadian complain about Mr. Robinson's church work.
