

OF INTEREST TO WOMEN

TO REMOVE THE "SHINE."

"Shiny" asks what is the best way to renovate a good black woollen skirt which has become shiny through wear.

Sponging with hot water and a little cloudy ammonia, and pressing with a hot iron used over a damp cloth will very often remove the shiny appearance. Another method is to sponge shiny garments with benzine; afterward, when it is thoroughly dry, pressing on the wrong side with a hot iron; but I have not myself tried this method. Old fashioned people used to boil leaves of the English ivy in water and sponge black dresses with this water, afterward pressing, using a damp cloth.

RUST STAINS.

"Anxious" asks how to remove rust from fine damask.

Soak the spots in lemon juice and hold them in the full current of steam from a boiling kettle. The stains must be held close to the spout of the kettle to get the steam while it still is very hot. Rinse out the lemon juice with boiling hot water after a time and apply fresh juice and steam again. If persisted in, this method is infallible. Wash and boil the damask afterward in the usual way.

TO CLEAN KID GLOVES.

"Ethel" asks the best way to clean kid gloves at home; also to remove the ring that gasoline off-

en leaves on clothes that have been cleaned with this fluid.

To clean kid gloves put them on the hands and wash in gasoline and wash while they are on the hands. Put on the line in the fresh air so that the smell of the gasoline will evaporate completely. Keep away from fire of any description.

The ring which gasoline often leaves on clothes can be removed by steaming over a tea kettle.


He leaves a wife and nine children. He had been employed on the road only a few months.

SPANISH STEAMER VICTIM.


Was Sunk by German Submarine—The Crew Rescued.


Among Roumanians




