### WEDNESDAY'S 22 INNING GAME WAS A RECORD ONE FOR LENGTH

Wednesday's 22-inning game at Ebbets Field, in which Brooklyn triumphed over Pittsburgh, was the longest ever played in the National League. Up until Wednesday the record had been 21 innings, a game between Pittsburgh and the Giants, played at Forbes Field, Pittsburgh, July 17, 1914, going that distance. Rube Marquard beat Babe Adams, 2 to 1, in that 21-inning contest.

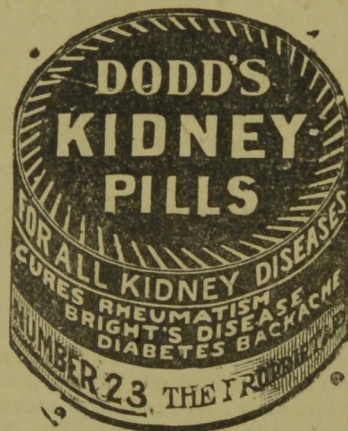
