WOMAN'S TROUSERS LIKELY TO BE IN VOGUE THIS FALL

Yes, they're here. Trousers for women and not for working women, either. Formal functions this fall and winter will witness the advent of trouser evening gowns. The heralding of the feminine "breeches" will come this evening when the semi-annual style show of the Chicago Garment Manufacturers' Association opens at the Auditorium.

The show will not be a mere parade of beautiful damsels in exquisite garments, but will tinge of musical comedies and vaudeville. "Awake, America!" a patriotic spectacle, is the vehicle for the exhibition of the coming mode. The proceeds of the show will be turned over to the Navy Relief Society for use in the Great Lakes auxiliary, of which Mrs. W. A. Moffett, wife of the commandant of the station is president. Sousa's Jacky band will furnish the music at each of the performances.
