HOUSEHOLD RECIPES

THREE-EGG DOUGHNUTS

This recipe will make about three dozen. Two and one-quarter cups pastry flour. One tablespoon of flour per cup less when using ordinary bread flour. One teaspoon of cream tartar, one-half teaspoon soda, one-quarter tea spoon of salt, speck of nutmeg or one-quarter teaspoon vanilla.

Beat the yolks of the eggs stiff and lemon color, and add to the sugar, add one-half cup of sweet cream. If the cream is sour, use three-quarters of a teaspoon of soda in cream, and three-quarters teaspoon of cream tartar stirred in flour: The amount of the latter depends upon the sourness of the cream. Stir in the dry material, roll and cut with a small dough-

nut cutter. Test the fat with a small bit of dough; if the dough comes to the top a light brown color in one minute, the fat is right. If it is smoky it is too hot. Do not put too many in at once. As soon as the cakes come to the top, turn them. When cooled a bit sprinkle with powdered sugar.

RAISIN PUFFS.

One-half cupful butter, two tablespoons sugar, one egg, three-quarters cupful sweet milk, two cupfuls flour, two teaspoonfuls of baking powder, one teacupful of chopped raisins. Steam for half an hour in buttered cups. Serve with cream and sugar.

Montreal Man Arrested in Chicago

Chicago, Jan. 30.—A man believed to be L. Henri Charlebois, formerly secretary of the government's river commission in Montreal, is under arrest here today.

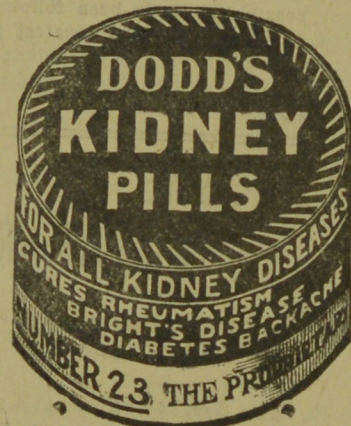

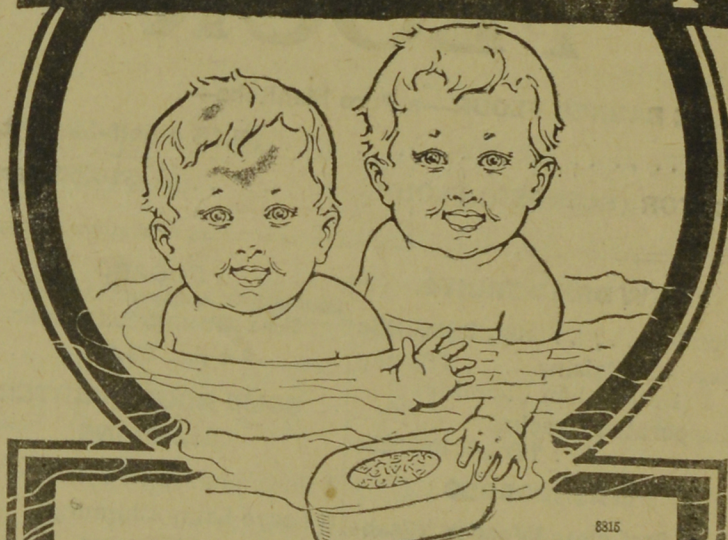
