## TO REDUCE A DOUBLE CHIN.

A double chin is not attractive. The following exercise is a good reducer: Stand erect in a military position, placing the hands lightly on the hips, fingers forward. 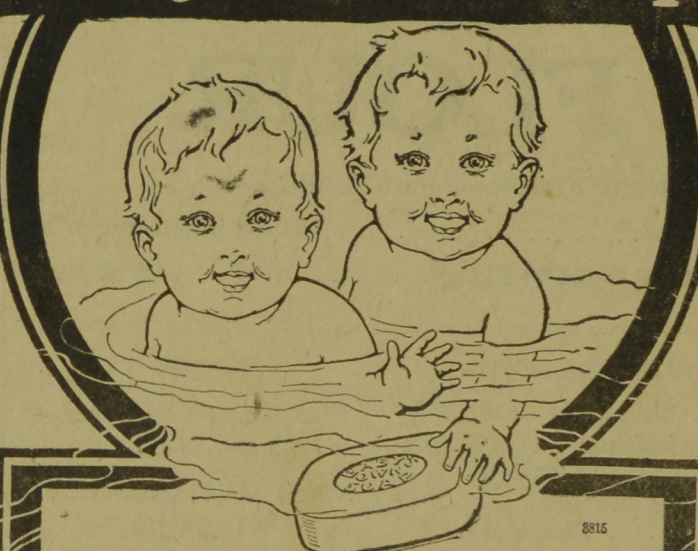
