

After the well organized comfort of France, even being in the war zone a few days in Italy brings home to one what the Italians have London, Dec. 3. (via Reuter's Ottawa Agency) — Reuter's correspondent at French headquarters in Italy cables under yesterday's date:

"For the moment these seems to be a truce in the battle between Brenta and the Piave, the reason being that the Austro-Germans have been forced to pause for breath after many days of unsuccessful attacks.

"The interlude of calm, however, must not deceive us. Heavier and still heavier enemy attacks must be expected. The Germans and Austrians have benefited by the fine dry weather of the last ten days to bring up reinforcements of artillery and the Italian airmen are constantly locating new enemy battery positions.

"THINK WAR

Amsterdam, Dec. 3. — General von Ludendorf, right hand man of Field Marshal von Hindenburg, is quoted



by a correspondent of the Neue Freie Press as making the pre-diction recently at German headquar-ters that the war will not end in a draw, but be decided in favor of the

Central powers.

The correspondent, says the Vienna despatch, secured this expression from von Ludendorff in conversations with him during a visit to headquarters where he also talked with von Hindonlung

"It appears the Russians are the first to be inclined for peace," General Ludendorff said. "I will not say that I regard the Bolsheviki manifestation as a peace offer," he continued. "There must be a secure government to this purpose, one which possesses. "There must be a secure government for this purpose, one which possesses power to enforce internally and externally the results of the negotiations with us. Of course, we can conclude an armistice with Russia at any time as soon as we have the assurance that it would be maintained. A general aristice, however, will be difficult to achieve."

General von Ludendorff expressed belief that a general armistice would interrupt submarine activity and al-low the Entente to improve its position, while on the other hand no sup-plies would reach the Central pow-ers.
