## OF INTEREST TO WOMEN

BEANS, BEANS, BEANS!

And Again Beans—Four Recipes for  
Making Them Palatable.

One of the Cornell reading course  
bulletins gives a number of excellent  
bean recipes. Here are a few:

#### Baked Bean Loaf.

One pint of cold baked beans, 1 egg  
beaten, 1 cupful bread crumbs, salt and  
pepper, 1 tablespoon finely minced  
onion, 2 tablespoons tomato catsup.  
Combine the ingredients and shape  
the mixture into a loaf. Bake it for  
25 minutes. Serve with strips of broil-  
ed bacon on the top.

#### Bean Muffins.

Combine these ingredients in the  
order given: 2 eggs, well beaten, 1  
cup of cold boiled bean pulp, half a cup  
of milk, one-third cup melted fat, 1  
teaspoon salt, 2 cups flour, 2 teaspoons  
baking powder. Bake the muffins in  
greased muffin pans for 20 or 25 min-  
utes. These muffins make a good bor-  
der for the pot roast, served with  
brown gravy.

#### Bean Timbales.

Combine these ingredients in the or-  
der given: 1 cup cold boiled or baked  
bean pulp, 1 cup milk, 2 eggs, well  
beaten, 1 tablespoon melted butter, a  
half teaspoon salt, one-eighth teaspoon  
paprika. Pour the mixture into cus-  
tard cups. Set the cups into a pan of  
hot water. Bake the custard in a mod-  
erate oven until it is set.

#### EGGLESS COOKERY.

##### Very Good Cookies.

Cream together one cup of butter  
and one cup of sugar. Add one-half  
cup of cream or milk and one teaspoon-  
ful of baking powder sifted in with  
four cups of flour. Roll very thin on a  
well floured board, cut out, sprinkle  
with sugar and cinnamon and bake.

##### Apple Sauce Cake.

Cream together one and one-half  
cups of sugar and one-half cup of but-

ter. When soft and very light, add  
one and one-half cups of apple sauce  
and one teaspoonful of soda dissolved  
in the apple sauce. Add also one-half  
teaspoonful of cinnamon, one-half tea-  
spoonful of nutmeg, one-quarter tea-  
spoonful of ground cloves, three-quar-  
ters cup of seeded raisins, and two  
cups of flour. Mix the currants and  
raisins with a little of the flour to keep  
them from settling together.

## LOST TRENCH RECOVERED

British Army Headquarters in  
France, Dec. 3.—British troops last  
night reoccupied a section of a trench  
on the high ground southwest of Bour-  
lon village, on the Cambrai front,  
which was lost on Friday. The town  
of Masnières, which was evacuated  
by the British, was shelled last night  
by British artillery.

General Byng's troops last night  
pressed near to the village of Villiers-  
Guislain and along the ridge southeast  
of that place, and their line now is  
fairly near the town.

It is estimated that the Germans  
had about twenty divisions for their  
assault on Friday which, except for  
the first Ypres battle, is regarded as  
having been their heaviest attack on  
the British.

The Germans attacked the British  
positions at La Vauquerie, southwest  
of Cambrai, at 8.50 o'clock this morn-  
ing and an hour later it was reported  
that they had been successfully beat-  
en off. Today's attack followed three  
futile attempts made by the enemy to  
take this village yesterday afternoon.

#### EX-PREMIER ILL.

Belleville, Ont., Dec. 4.—There is no  
change in the condition of Sir Mac-  
kenzie Bowell, and his physicians have  
abandoned hope for his recovery.
