

CORWIN HAL 2.13 1-2
BOUGHT BY ROCKFORD
FOR ISLAND STABLE

Beaten Here Two Years Again in Match-
ed Race by James K. Newbro--
Reported to be Going Better.

The Sydney Record says: Sam Rockford, one of the best known figures in the light harness racing games in Eastern Canada, is to campaign Corwin Hal, 2.13½, during the coming season, according to reports received here from Prince Edward Island. Rockford recently purchased Corwin Hal for a P. E. I. horseman and just now the Island followers of the game are all caught over the importation of free-for-allers.

Corwin Hal was brought to the Maritime Provinces by the McDonald Bros. of St. John, and raced with more or less success for them in New Brunswick. He has a world of speed and if given the proper training should make it interesting for the other fast ones next season. At one time horsemen were interested in a matched race between Corwin Hal and James K. Newbro 2.13½, the star member of Tommy Raymond, the Fredericton trainer's stable. Newbro won, however, without much difficulty, Corwin Hal being erratic throughout the race, which took place two years ago in Fredericton.

The acquisition of Corwin Hal by the Prince Edward Island horsemen makes the second free-for-all race purchased there during the past winter. Rexheart, 2.12½, was secured from R. H. Edwards, of Halifax, and with this fast pacer, Corwin Hal, Sister Patch, 2.8½, Princess Elita, 2.15½, and Helen R., 2.16, the opportunity for free-for-all classes in the midsummer meetings is more favorable in 1917 than for some years past.

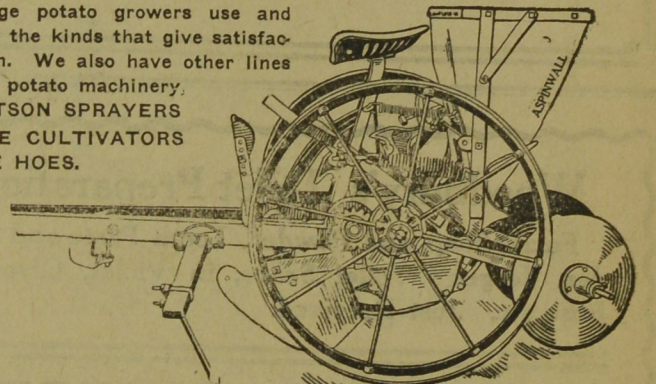

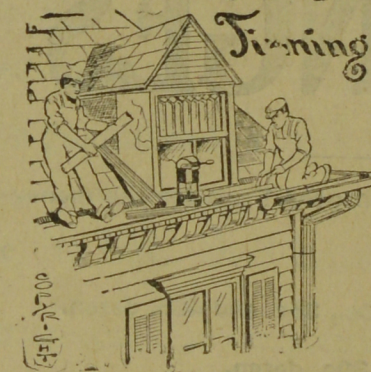

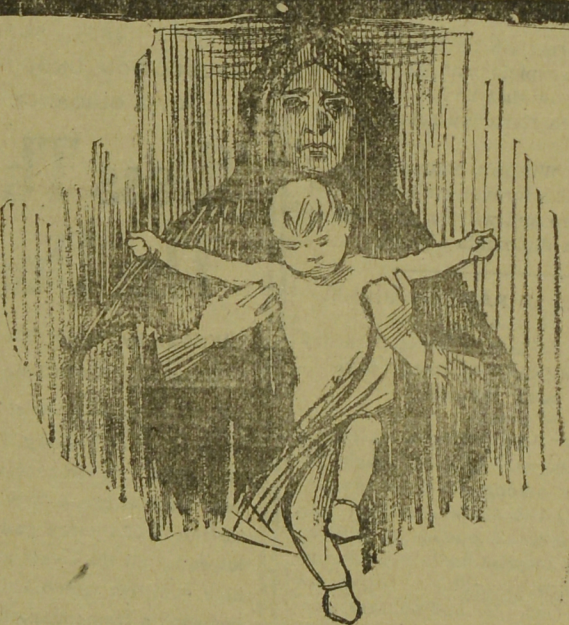
