ADMIRAL DEWEY HAS PASSED AWAY

Washington, Jan. 16.—Admiral Geo. Dewey, hero of Manila and by priority the ranking naval officer of the world, died at his home here at 5.56 p.m. today in his 80th year.

With Admiral Dewey passed away the great national hero of the United States, who won fame for himself and added incidentally a volume to the history of the American republic when he destroyed the Spanish fleet in Manila Bay on May 1, 1898.

For his work in this war Dewey was lauded throughout the United States and he was presented with a handsome residence as a token of gratitude, and which he later transferred to his wife.

DRIVING DAM ON UPPER NASHWAAK CARRIED OUT

Heavy Loss to Nashwaak Pulp & Paper Company—Inspection Made.

The heavy rain on Sunday last did large damage on the upper waters of the Nashwaak. A dam constructed by the Nashwaak Pulp & Paper Company last summer near Nashwaak Lake, was carried out by the heavy rush of water. This dam is needed during the stream driving operations and its loss is a severe one to the company.

Mr. George Kilburn, of this city, rafting superintendent for the Nashwaak Pulp & Paper Co., left on Monday for the Upper Nashwaak to inspect the dam and report upon the extent of the damage. He has not yet returned.

TO GATHER NEWS ABOUT CANADIANS

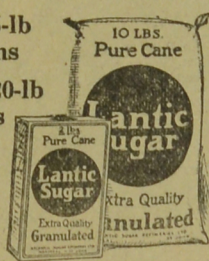
