OF INTEREST TO WOMEN

OF YOUR WOODWORK IS SHABBY. TO CLEAN PLASTER ORNAMENTS.

When wood is badly dented or scratched it is often a problem to know how to get rid of the marks. Fold a piece of blotting paper at least four times, and then saturate with water, allowing the superfluous moisture to drip away. Now heat a flat iron until it is about the warmth required for laundry work. Place the damp blotting paper over the dent and press firmly with the iron. As soon as the paper dries examine the mark. It will be found that the cavity has filled up to a surprising extent. When the dent is very deep a second or even a third treatment on these lines might be tried. Repolishing will clear away even the slight marks that might finally remain.

Y. W. asks the best way to clean plaster ornaments.

To clean any plaster ornament, such as busts, vases, &c., dip in clear starch mixed with water. When dry, brush off any extra starch that may remain in the object.

SCRATCHES ON GLASS.

L. M. asks how to remove scratches from plate glass.

Slight scratches on plate glass can be removed by rubbing gently with a pad of cotton wool and then with a pad of cotton velvet, charged with fine jeweller's rouge.

TO WASH BLANKETS.

W. M. asks how to wash blank-

ets at home so they will not shrink. Put two large tablespoonfuls of borax and one pint of soft soap into a tub of cold water; when dissolved put in a pair of blankets and let them remain over night. In the morning rub them out, rinse thoroughly in two waters and hang them to dry. Do not wring them. This recipe also applies to the washing of all kinds of flannel and woollen goods.

"SAFETY FIRST" PIONEER

N. S. Dunlop Introduced Novelties Into Canadian Railroad Life

Mr. N. S. Dunlop, tax and insurance commissioner of the C.P.R., who decided to take a prolonged rest upon the advice of his physician, had been in the service of the company for 29 years. He joined in 1888 at Toronto. The year afterward he was appointed tax and insurance commissioner and claims adjuster. In these capacities Mr. Dunlop did excellent work.

Mr. Dunlop may be said to be the father of Safety First on the Canadian railways; and into this work he threw himself with splendid enthusiasm—going much to popularize the movement. As far as the outside public is concerned, he is best known as the creator of the floral department of the C.P.R. He began in 1889 to save flower seeds from his own garden; and conceived the idea of spreading the cult of flowers over the system. He was a flower, nature and book lover; and the work was congenial to him. He sent out seeds and bulbs to the agents and others along the system; and soon, from ocean to ocean, the plots in front of hundreds of stations were ablaze with flowers. He gave prizes; and labored in every way to make this feature notable. In this he succeeded abundantly.

Mr. Dunlop is a member of the New York State Stenographic Association, one of the oldest and largest associations of shorthand in the world; but his brochure, "What the Flowers Tell Us," and his work of love in adorning a big railway system with floral beauty, will be Mr. Dunlop's best recognition in connection with his long service with the C.P.R.

POLICE COURT CASES ADJOURNED

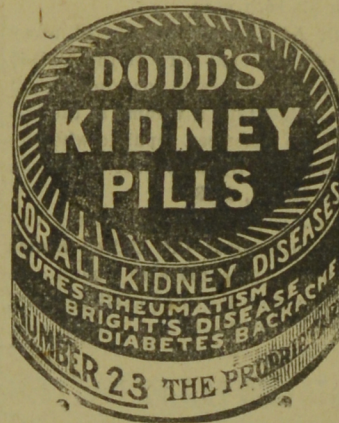
METHODIST PIONEER DEAD.

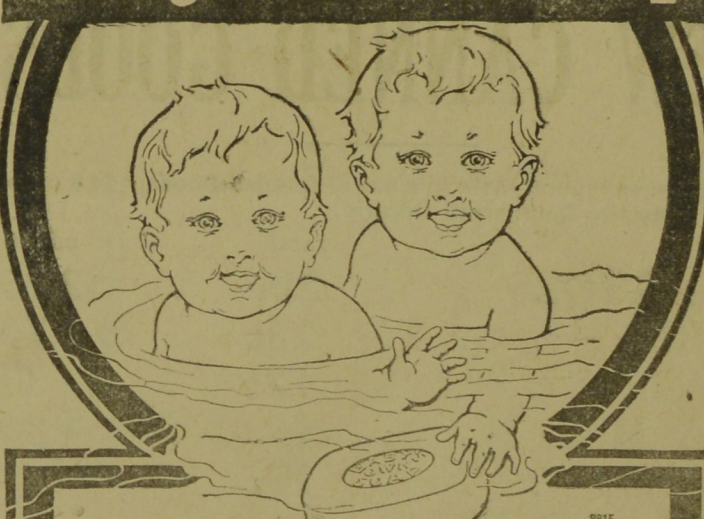
