N. S. Dunlop Introduced Novelties Into Canadian Railroad Life

Canadian Railroad Life

Mr. N. S. Dunlop, tax and insurance commissioner of the C.P.R., who decided to take a prolonged rest upon the advice of his physician, had been in the service of the company for 29 years. He joined in 1888 at Toronto. The year afterward he was appointed tax and insurance commissioner and claims adjuster. In these capacities Mr. Dunlop did excellent work.

Mr. Dunlop may be said to be the father of Safety First on the Canadian railways; and into this work he threw himself with splendid enthusiasm—coing much to popularize the movement. As far as the outside public is concerned, he is best known as the creator of the floral department of the C.P.R. He began in 1889 to save flower seeds from his own garden; and conceived the idea of spreading the cult of flowers over the system. He was a flower, nature and book lover; and the work was congenial to him. He sent out seeds and bulbs to the agents and others along the system; and soon, from ocean to ocean, the plots in front of hundreds of stations were ablaze with flowers. He gave prizes; and labored in every way to make this feature notable. In this he succeeded abundantly.


