E. I JUROR HAD TOO MUCH BOUZE

Judge Scores Authorities For Failure
To Enforce the Prohibitory
Law.

Charlottetown, Jan. 16.—The supreme court which met this morning had to be adjourned till this afternoon as one of the jurymen had become drunk and incapable when the court met in the morning.

Chief Justice Sullivan read a certificate from a doctor stating that the juror was suffering from acute indisposition. This would prevent his attendance at court for two days.

The judge made very caustic comments on the non-enforcement of the prohibition law and urged public action to drive out of existence those responsible for the outrageous condition of affairs. It was absolutely a disgrace to this prohibition province, he said, that the administration of justice is interfered with and the court has to be adjourned to accommodate worthless, drunken fellows.

He also scored the authorities for bringing the law into disrepute by letting prohibition violators out of jail before their sentences expired, and for appointing violators to public offices.

The doctor who certified as to the juror's illness also came in for severe criticism.

A new jury was appointed and the case which had made some progress was started over again.

THREE MEN LOSE LIVES IN A FIRE

Detroit Grocery Was Burned Out—
Armory Burned at Troy, N. Y.—
Hotel Destroyed.

Detroit, Mich., Jan. 16.—Three men were asphyxiated in a fire which destroyed a grocery store and apartment building on the east side here early today. One of the victims was identified as Theodore Murphy, 63 years old, who with the other two, as yet unidentified, was sleeping in the basement.

Armory Destroyed.

Troy, N. Y., Jan. 16.—By a fire of unknown origin, the armory of the second regiment, New York National Guard, of that city, was totally destroyed by fire early today. The armory was first built in 1884 and rebuilt and enlarged in 1902. It was valued at \$200,000.

Ontario Hotel Burned.

London, Ont., Jan. 16.—Fire which started from the furnace room, destroyed the big Walker Hotel at Walerston, Ont.

W. J. Ward, the proprietor, rescued unconscious from the second story, is in the hospital in a serious condition. The guests all escaped.

HEAVY FIGHTING ON ROUMANIAN FRONT

Petrograd, via London, Jan. 16.—Heavy fighting continues on the northern Rumanian front, with varying results.

The War Office today gave out the following report: "Battles continue with alternating successes in the region southwest of Pralva, 19 versts south of the confluence of the rivers Kasiho and Trotus. Rumanian and Russian troops which were attacking seven versts south of Pralva, have advanced two versts. Two night attacks by the enemy at a point two versts south of Rekos, on the river Suchitza, were beaten back by the Rumanians."

"In the region of Vadeni, ten versts west of Galatz, fighting still continues. Our aviators dropped bombs on Barjani and Sudami, on the Danube, in the region of Braila, and caused fires on some vessels."

"In the Black Sea one of our submarines sank two enemy ships near the Bosphorus."

The Russo-Rumanian defence of the Sereth line in northern Rumania has turned to the form of heavy counter attacks which are being delivered both along the Moldavian frontier and between Fokshani and the Danube.

A Big Death List From Pneumonia

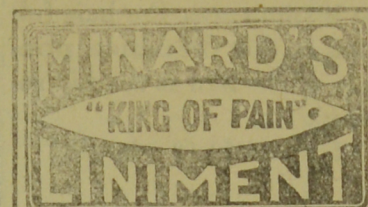
New York, Jan. 16.—Pneumonia caused more than 500 deaths and influenza took a toll of sixty in this city last week. Health Commissioner Emerson, in a statement published today, attributes the spread of respiratory diseases largely to the practice of spitting in public places.
