Salamagundi Sandwiches.

Wash, skin and bone a herring, and chop fine. Add a chopped chicken breast, one-third of a cup of ham, two hard boiled eggs, chopped fine; season to taste with chopped onion, salt and pepper. Blend together with a French dressing and spread on buttered slices of bread.

Sarona Sandwiches.

Mix into half a pound of cream cheese worked to a paste, three hard boiled eggs, chopped fine; a few chopped onions and season with salt, pepper and a little mustard.

Importers Predict That Price Will Ascend Because of Prohibition in Russia, and Other Reasons.

New York, March 16.—Importers are predicting that tea will increase in price in a few days and blame it largely on prohibition in Russia.

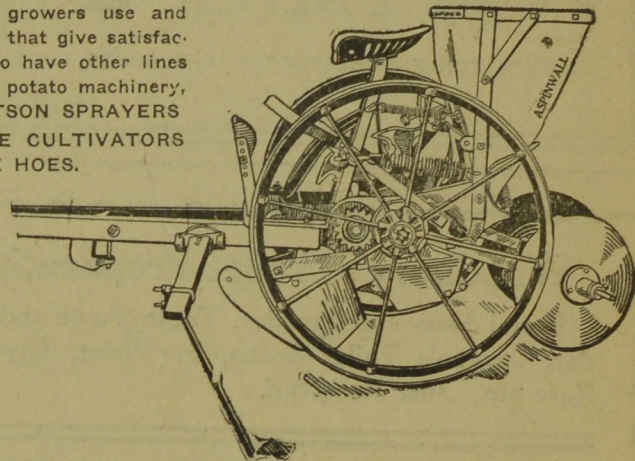

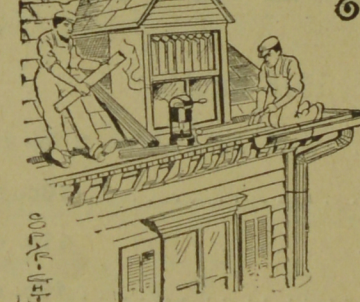
