A VELVET NEGLIGEE.

Something new in a negligee is made of yellow velvet. It is cut like a simple wrapper in a low "U" at the neck, and the angel shaped, set in sleeves stop just below the elbow. The novelty comes in the

front closing. From the top it is cut diagonally on the right hand edge of hip depth, on the left a piece of the velvet continues on diagonally to make a hip sash. This knots in the back with one that comes from the side seam on the other side. The right hand edge, below the extension sash, falls in a straight edge to the floor. All edges except the closing front are decorated with a fringed ruche of yellow satin.

FIRST AID FOR CROUP.

The woman who lives in the country where it is impossible to reach a doctor quickly, is advised to take a few lessons in medical first aid. For example, every mother knows the pangs of fear she suffers when she hears her baby gasping with croup.

The first move for relief in croup is to apply to the throat hot flannels wrung out in boiling water. If the attack is bad a hot bath should be given. Give a teaspoon of powdered alum stirred into molasses. If the throat is very tight, a little brown sugar will bring relief.

PAPER CLIPS TO HOLD SEAMS

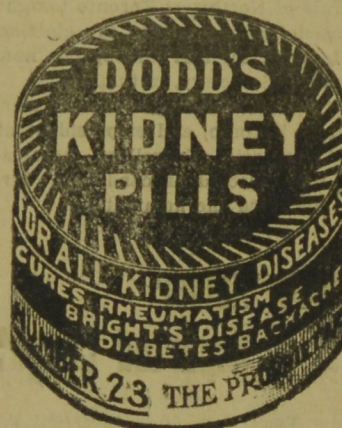
