of July, has been fixed by proclamation for the celebration of Dominion Day, and the committee have recommended that the celebration on that day be as "general as possible, without expensive and elaborate display, as befits war time, and carried out on the broadest social and democratic lines, a plain sincere people's demonstration, a tribute to the founders of our Dominion and the institutions and ideals of

our common country,"

are fighting.

And we further request that on Mon-lay, the 2nd of July, all municipal and city officers co-operate with the var-ious patriotic localities, and that all citizens by a display of flags and suit-able decorations at their homes and places of business, give hearty support and countenance to this movement, that this semi-centennial celebration preciation and grateful acknowledgment of the many blessings and great prosperity our Province has enjoyed, and the continued unity and patriotism

of the Canadian people.




