WANTS SPAIN TO MAINTAIN NEUTRALITY

London, Feb. 1.—A Reuter despatch from Madrid says the Spanish minister of the interior, on communicating to the newspaper the note of the Central Powers regarding their new naval measures, appealed to the main view of the necessity of preserving their neutrality, and on account of the gravity of the situation to observe discreet composure.

The minister said he feared that when the purport of the note became known disorders might occur, particularly in the eastern districts, as the policy of the Central Powers meant interruption of foreign trade and grave dislocation of the internal life of the country.

The impression prevails in Madrid, the correspondent says, that parliament will be adjourned in order to prevent discussion which might be dangerous.

NEFARIOUS WORK OF TORY MACHINE IN DORCHESTER

False Accusations Circulated Through the Press During the Recent Campaign---Toties Monopolized the Only Telegraph Wire in the County and Liberal Newspaper Men Had to Send Reports via Boston and N. Y.---Tory whiskey seized.

Our columns have proved to the English Tory readers during the past week to what depths this machine will sink the character of our province.

"Half the story of the nefarious work performed in Dorchester will never be told, but sufficient facts are in the possession of Mr. Cannon today to make this country sink with shame when he exposes the contemptible methods put into force to defeat him in that county.

We have said before that facts and figures do not lie, and we have given the lie to every one of the false accusations that were circulated through out the Tory press during this campaign.

Do the English speaking Tories know that the very first act in Dorchester County that showed the hand of the Tory party was uncovered in the presence of a large number of newspaper men who made good use of their time to not only distort and misrepresent the speeches of Mr. Cannon, but they monopolized the only telegraph wire out of the county, so that the Liberal reporters, including those of the Telegraph, were handicapped in sending out the truth.

On one occasion one of our representatives had to telephone his copy over thirty miles, and from that point have it telegraphed to Boston, then to New York and from there to Montreal and Quebec, in order that the misquoted statements of Mr. Cannon could be refuted in this paper.

The object of this campaign was to obtain material that would inflame the English speaking Canadians. Every possible effort was made to fan the flames of racial bigotry. Everyone knows that even the Tory press itself reported that in the event of Mr. Seigny's defeat the Tories would make it a cause for bringing on elections. Then, later, when they found that the record of Mr. Seigny in 1911 was being made the principal battle cry by Mr. Cannon and his friends, they became frightened and changed their tactics by suggesting a postponement of parliament, which was ceded to by Sir Wilfrid Laurier.

When the 45 cases of whiskey on the way to a Conservative headquarters were seized by the provincial revenue officers, the Tory papers spread the report that the seizure was made by a federal revenue officer to leave the impression that the whiskey was found in the possession of the Liberals.

When Hon. Mr. Blondin found himself in a remote village where there were no reporters around, he told the electors the Allison scandals meant nothing, because it was the English government's money, and it would be robbed anyway. When he touched on conscription, he said it should not bother the electors of Dorchester, as they could easily escape by going to the United States.

On the same day the information was sent to the Canadian Press, which supplies the leading papers of Canada with a news service. It started to send out this report, and the newspapers of Canada had barely received the first sheet, when an order was received "to kill the report."

Fortunately the Telegraph had its own independent report and our readers did not suffer in consequence.

TURKISH DELEGATE REACHES GENEVA

Paris, Feb. 1.—Djavid Bey, former Turkish minister of finance, has arrived at Geneva, according to the *Matin*, as a delegate from the Turkish commission to get in touch with the Entente powers.

Djavid Bey was selected, the *Matin* says, because he was the only Ottoman minister who refused to sign the tirade proclaiming the opening of hostilities.

Another Turkish politician, Moury Bey, is at St. Moritz and is said to have declared openly that the partisans of Talaat Bey, one of the triumvirate in charge of Constantinople, are nationalists before everything else, and do not intend to pull the chestnuts out of the fire for Germany.

The farm can be made a more attractive place than a city shop or office. That it is not now, with mud to the front door and extending to the stable, the barn—anywhere that a boy has to go while doing the chores, none will deny.

But this is not necessary, as you will see by visiting a model farm. Dry walks, clean stables and comfortable places in which to work are not only possible, but are cheaper and easier to maintain than the rattletraps that pass as farm buildings.

DOUKHOBORS THRIVE

Strange Communists Make Good as Fruit Growers in British Columbia

The Doukhobors of British Columbia who are in a sort of "get together" movement are known as "The Christian Community of Universal Brotherhood," and it is claimed for them that they live in peace and contentment which is not enjoyed by any other sect of people in the world. M. Verigin claims they would all have been enormously wealthy had the Dominion Government, in 1907, not cancelled the 3,000 homesteads in the Yorkton district which the "community" had improved. The reason for this cancellation was, because the brotherhood could not by reason of their religion, take the oaths necessary to be taken in obtaining a homestead.

The religion of the brotherhood prohibits them from partaking in war, and consequently no members ever enlisted. When they found it impossible to secure homesteads, the brotherhood decided to purchase 20,000 acres of orchard lands in British Columbia, and they have since about one-quarter of this land in a splendid state of cultivation, and have erected on it a jam factory, saw mills and other industries. About 30 carloads of fruit each year are shipped from the community.

Mr. Verigin has a proposition to have the fruits from his orchards sold in markets on the prairies which have previously been stocked with United States fruits. The crops from the Saskatchewan and Alberta brotherhood farms have been very good and the whole brotherhood is experiencing increasing prosperity.
