Montreal, Jan. 12 .- F. A. Skelton, secretary of the Canadian Car & Foundry Co., said the destruction of the plant in New Jersey was the first mishap of any consequence which had oc curred since the plant had been in op eration. No information had been re ceived, he said, to indicate that the conflagration was of incendiary origin As regards insurance, he said, the plant was well protected, being covered against fire, explosion and loss of pro
