A NOVEL SEWING TABLE.

A charming sewing stand can be made out of an old piano stool. Buy some cretonne, cut a circle slightly larger than the top of the stool, and sew around it a piece fifteen inches deep, gathered full, with a two-inch heading at the top.

Only the heading will show on the right side of the cretonne until the bottom edge is brought up to meet it and six generous pockets are made to hold everything needed.

Then slip it, pockets and all, over the top of the stool, fasten it neatly with a few brass headed screws, and with a few more tack a large flat sewing basket to the top. The basket revolves which will be found a great convenience.

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
