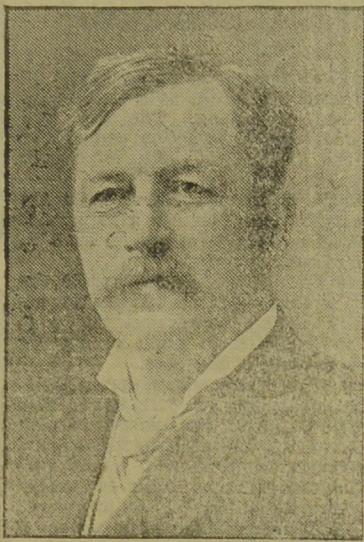

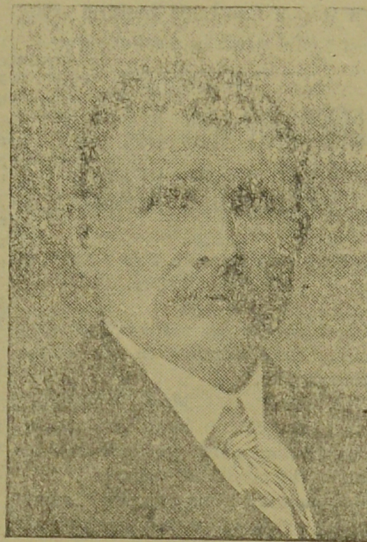

DOMINION ROYAL COMMISSION HANDS OUT REPORT

(Continued from page 1.)

Overseas Communication.

Not the least important phase of the commission's report deals with the subject of overseas communications, embracing uniform harbor development for the accommodation of the vessels of length, beam and draught required for the cheap and speedy transport of the empire's merchandise, mail communication and telegraphic communication.

The development of imperial mail routes which do not pass over foreign soil is advocated, and it is shown how by the means time may be saved in the delivery of mail in the antipodes. It is suggested the governments of the dominions arrange matters so that in 1921, when the time for giving notice to terminate existing contracts expires, they may be ready to initiate imperial services.

Better Cable Service.

The commission recommends better and cheaper cable facilities for handling press news to Canada and other parts of the empire.

The commission deals appreciatively with the difficulties of news dissemination throughout the Dominion.

"The present system," it says, "is the subject of much heartburning both in eastern and western Canada, and is viewed with grave apprehension by newspaper proprietors and others interested in future development of the Dominion in its relations to the empire as a whole."

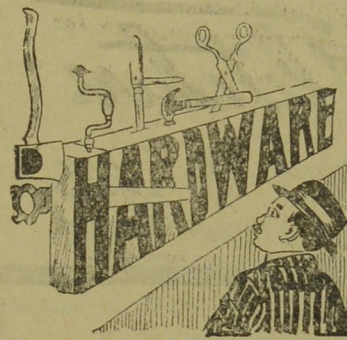

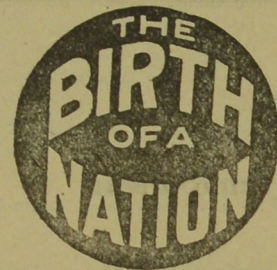
