GOVERNMENT HAS TROUBLE SECURING CANDIDATES

Only One Man Nominated in Westmorland Who Has Consented to Run---
Speaker Melanson and Mr. Humphry Have Dropped Out.

Moncton, Feb. 7.—The proceedings at the government convention for the county of Westmorland here today are not likely to give much encouragement to Hon. J. A. Murray and his supporters in this election. The convention for the county was held in a store, not a very large one at that, in Main street, and after a prolonged and heated debate, Antoine J. Legere, of Moncton, consented to allow himself to be nominated as a candidate. A. E. Trites of Salisbury accepted the nomination provisionally. P. G. Mahoney, the defeated Minister of Public Works, in the by-election last spring, and Col. F. B. Black, refused to allow themselves to be nominated.

It is said that Col. Black strongly criticized the government for reorganizing without giving Westmorland its proper representation in the cabinet. The debate was very warm at times and the convention finally adjourned to meet again at Sackville next Friday.

In the meantime the party leaders hope to persuade Messrs. Mahoney and Black to reconsider their decision and allow themselves to be nominated.

The proceedings today caused a feeling of depression among the government party in Moncton tonight.

Fell Back on Dr. Price.

The government convention for Moncton city was held here this evening, when Dr. O. B. Price was nominated. It will be remembered that Dr. Price was nominated for the House of Commons for Westmorland county and the fact that the party was compelled to nominate him again for the local house is taken to mean that no other man could be found who was willing to face the great odds on Feb. 24.

The opposition forces, it is generally conceded, are stronger in Westmorland county and in Moncton today than ever, and they declare that their able ticket will sweep the county.

The Kings Convention.

Hampton, N. B., Feb. 7.—The old government ticket, Hon. J. A. Murray, Geo. B. Jones and Hedley V. Dickson, was chosen at the government convention here yesterday morning.

These men are the present representatives of the county and will run against the opposition ticket, composed of Dr. Pearson, E. S. Carter and Fred Sharpe. The feeling is that the respectable vote of the county will line up strongly for the opposition on February 24th.

In Kent County.

Reston, Feb. 7.—The Conservative convention here today nominated Geo. A. Hutchinson, barrister, of Richibucto; Hon. Dr. D. V. Landry, of Buctouche, and Frank O. Richards, councillor, of St. Ignace, as the government ticket for Kent.

MOTOR TANK STEAMER IN SERIOUS TROUBLE

Boston, Feb. 7.—The motor tank steamer Daylite, which broke adrift from the tug Resolute, 100 miles south of Cape Sable, N.S., in a storm Sunday, was located today by the coast-guard cutter Gresham, and will be taken in tow for Boston as soon as the weather moderates.

A message from the cutter stated that the crew was aboard, but that it was impossible to get a line to the vessel because of the heavy seas. While the Gresham's position was not given, it was thought that the Daylite had drifted many miles from the point where she became helpless, after the hawser from the tug parted.

The Resolute, with her coal supply almost exhausted, arrived here today and reported that she left the Daylite in a terrific storm, picked her up after a search of 24 hours, and lost her again Monday night.

FEENEY-READY NUPTIALS.

J. L. Feeney Wedded to Miss Marie Ready at Fairville Yesterday.

St. John, Feb. 7.—In the presence of immediate relatives and friends, Miss Marie Ready, B.A., of Manawagonish Road, Fairville, was united in marriage to Mr. John L. Feeney, C.E., of Fredericton, with nuptial mass, at five o'clock this morning, in St. Rose's Church, at Fairville, by the pastor, Rev. Charles Collins.

The bride, who was unattended, wore a travelling suit of grey broadcloth trimmed with moleskin, and wore a white fox fur, with hat of silver lace and carried a shower bouquet of orchids and lilies of the valley. She was given away by her uncle, Mr. Louis Ready. Following the ceremony breakfast was served at the home of the bride's grandmother, Mrs. James Ready.

Mr. and Mrs. Feeney left by early morning train for an extended honeymoon trip to Boston, New York and Upper Canadian cities. On their return they will reside at Fredericton.

Both young people have a large circle of friends through the province. Mr. Feeney holding the position of provincial road engineer, while the bride, since her graduation from Saint Bernard, Antigonish, several years ago, has been prominent in Catholic social circles. The wedding presents were beautiful and appropriate.

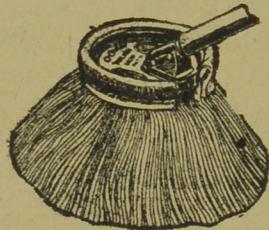

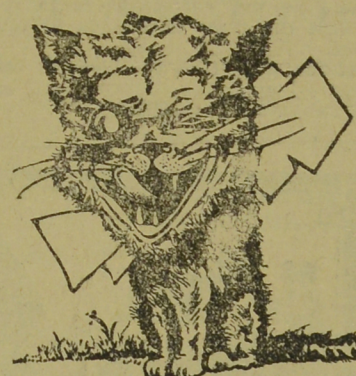
