London, Feb. 23.—The British forces operating against the Turks in the Tigris region of Mesopotamia have captured two lines of trenches near Sannaiyat, according to an official statement issued this evening. The statement says:

"Since the clearing of the Dahra bend of the Tigris all our efforts have been concentrated upon the taking of the Sannaiyaat position on the left bank of the Tigris.




