S. H. McKEE PASSED AWAY AFTER LONG ILLNESS

Masonic Funeral Sunday---Respected Resident of the City---Of Loyalist Descent.

Samuel Hanford McKee passed away at his home, King street, last night at the age of 72. The deceased had been confined to his bed for about nine weeks. Until recently the deceased had taken an active part in business, being a member of the well known firm of S. H. McKee & Sons, manufacturers of aerated water.

The late Mr. McKee was a descendant of John McKee, Loyalist, and was a native of St. John. His father, the late Samuel Hanford McKee, removed to Fredericton with his family in 1852.

Mr. McKee is survived by his wife, formerly Miss Jane Armour, daughter of the late Joseph Armour, of Fredericton, three sons and three daughters. The sons are Lieut. Col. Samuel Hanford McKee, C. M. G., who is second in command of the Westcliffe Eye and Ear Hospital at Folkestone, Eng., and a member of the Canadian Expeditionary Force; A. H. McKee, of the Department of Railways and Canals, Ottawa, and Private H. H. McKee, of the 141st Battalion, of Port Arthur. The daughters are Mrs. J. Harry Robertson, of Fredericton; Mrs. Frank Baird, of Woodstock, and Mrs. T. L. Fowler, of Fredericton. Mr. McKee is also survived by his brother, Hamilton McKee, with whom he was associated in business; also three sisters, Mrs. Geo. McFarlane, of Nashwaaksis, Mrs. Alex. Calder and Miss E. A. McKee, of Fredericton.

Mr. McKee was most prominent in Masonic circles. He was past master of Hiram Lodge, of Fredericton, past senior deacon of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, an old member of the Scottish Rite, of St. John, and a member of the Royal Order of Scotland.

The deceased all through his life was closely interested in horse-racing and was known as an authority on racing and horse news.

The funeral will take place Sunday at 2.30 p. m. Rev. J. S. Sutherland will conduct the service, and interment will be made at the Rural Cemetery. The funeral will be under Masonic auspices.

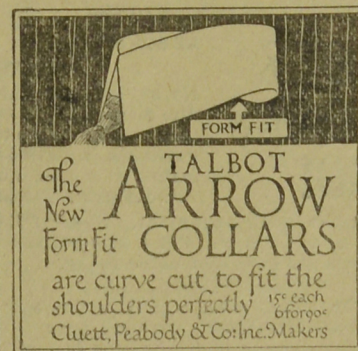
