NEW TRACK RECORD WAS MADE AT THE PRESQUE ISLE RACE MEET

Betty Dean, Owned by J. B. Williams, of Fort Fairfield, Stepped a Mile in 2.11 1/4—Dean Patch, Owned by G. B. Hayward, of Ashland, Broke Bone in His Leg—Pearl Bourbon Outside the Money in 2.14 Mixed Class.

Presque Isle, Aug. 2. — The circuit races here today brought out a good crowd and many considered it the best racing show ever put on this track. Every heat was driven to win, and there were many whipping finishes and considerable excitement, although three of the four events on the card went in straight heats.

A new track record was made by Betty Dean, owned by J. B. Williams of Fort Fairfield, who stepped the second heat of the 2.14 pace in 2.11 1/4, showing a faster clip in the first half. The fine race horse, Dean Patch, owned by G. B. Hayward of Ashland, met with an accident, making a misstep and breaking a small bone in the foreleg, and was barely able to limp to the stable. Jerome Boy, owned by Henry Good, which went bad in the 2.30 class yesterday after leading the field part of the first heat, died this morning and it was found that the horse had ruptured a blood vessel. 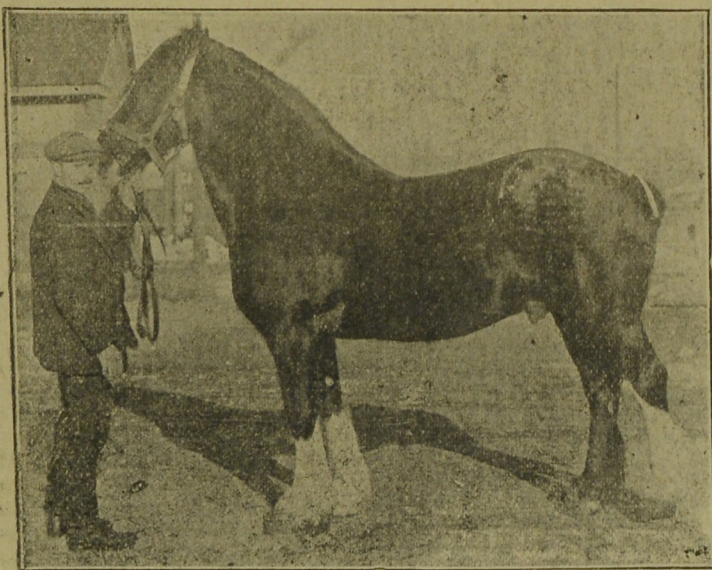
