He found it filled a long-felt need Its excellence surprised him, And now he's glad because the ad So deftly hypnotized him.



Hon. Mr. Carvell arrived in the prohad an opportunity to members of both parties. His object, frankly stated, was to endeavor to arrange the co-operation of both parties for the purpose of union candidates and thus avoid party contests in the coming election. 
