

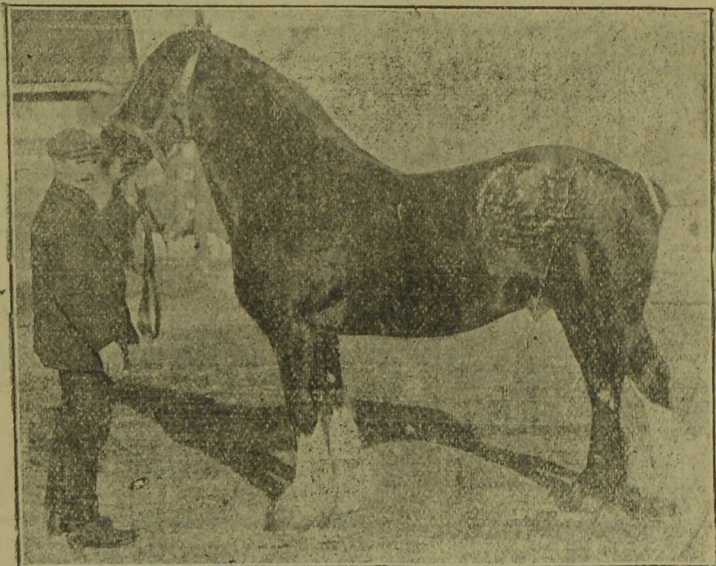

Sporting News

DAVE WARMAN WON EIGHT HEAT RACE FRIDAY

Free-for-All Pace at Combination Park Went Over from Thursday—Record Almost Equalled.

Boston, July 28. — Yesterday's showers carried the race meet at Combination Park over until this afternoon, three events being unfinished when rain made the footing unsafe. The moisture, however, held off long enough for Major Woolworth to win the fastest eight-heat race ever paced on a half-mile track.

This remarkable contest, six heats of which were raced on Thursday, averaged within a fraction of a second of the best on record over a mile track, and surely deserves the honor place among long races. From beginning to end it was a clean, blood-stirring battle, and one that will be talked about for a long time.

Major Woolworth was the contending horse in every heat, giving an exhibition of gameness that gained the admiration of every one fortunate enough to witness it.

Major Woolworth is owned by James F. Smith of New Bedford, and is in the stable of Dave Warman, who deserves considerable praise for the excellent condition of the horse as well as of his handling of him in the race. The Major is bred to be the game racer that he is.

It is the good old Village Farm blood that flows in his veins, his sire being The Abbe, 2:04, an unbeaten pacer and a brother to the former champion, The Abbot, 2:03 1/4, while his dam is a sister to another great race horse, Heir at Law, 2:05 1/4. She was a daughter of Mambrino King and Estabella. Major cost his owner \$1,600 at the New York auction last winter. His record is 2:05 1/4.

Other Race.

The other race finished at Combination yesterday was the 2-year-old trot which was won by Albert Hastings' Echo Direct, driven by Hugh Milam, who gave the public a glimpse of what a real trotter the youngster is, sending him the final quarter of the race in 32 1/4 seconds. Echo Direct is a son of his owner's horse, Echo Todd, 2:14 1/4, and Victoria Direct, dam of Director Todd, 2:07.

Scott Locke of Concord, N. H., was second to the winner with My Leaf, who came the double furlong distance of the second mile at a 2:10 clip.

The Zombro stallion Pegasus, who paced to a mark of 2:07 1/4, is winning races for the veteran, Charles Durfee, as a trotter on the California circuit. He has taken a record of 2:10 1/4.

Hnery Thomas, farm trainer for Stoughton Fletcher, owner of Peter the Great, has been suspended for the balance of the season. Thomas was believed to have been too much interested in the defeat of his former pupil, Colleen, at Cleveland.

DAVE MOREY ALLOWED NO HIT, NO RUN, NO PASS

Old Time Fredericton Twirler In Best of Form—Stan. Bates, Against Him, Rather Wild.

Oak Bluffs, July 26. — Dave Morey shut out the Wollaston club 8 to 0, without allowing a hit, run or base on balls. Keating featured for Oak Bluffs in hitting and fielding. W. Ganzel and Bates excelled for Wollaston.

Two former Fredericton pitchers figured in this game, Dave Morey and Stan Bates. Although Bates lost he had six strikeouts. Morey had seven. Bates was found for nine safe hits and had two wild pitches. He also hit three batters with the ball.

Springfield, July 26. — Hartford defeated Springfield here this afternoon, 8 to 0 in a weird game in which Umpire Connolly played the leading role and which was protested by the Springfield management. Umpire Connolly chased Manager O'Hara and Capt. Ray Mowe in the first inning, drove out Catcher Stevens in the seventh and find third baseman Mitchell \$10 in the eighth. The crowd waited for the umpire after the game and he was given police protection. Hartford won the game by bunching hits on Barron, two homers being included in the 14 hits made off him.
