

MEMBERS ARRIVING FOR  
PARLIAMENT OPENING

Montreal, Jan. 15.—An Ottawa despatch to the Star says:

A group of western members of parliament who reached Ottawa today are the first arrivals for the session. Some Maritime Province Senators are here, but the bulk of the sessional people will not come till Wednesday or Thursday, more particularly as the formal opening will not occur until Saturday. The principal theme of speculation relates to the extension of the terms of Parliament, and the outcome is more or less of a puzzle. Developments in respect to it will take place only when the debate on the address, starting a week from today, is disposed of.

The Liberals will early go into caucus on the question to determine their attitude. From views expressed by some who have arrived already, it appears that the proposal may be treated as premature, and an attempt made to defer consideration.

Another element would make a national or coalition government a condition to further prolongation of the term of parliament. From every viewpoint a situation of exceptional interest is promised.

There is a strong probability that Mr. Sevigny will be opposed in the coming by-elections, but the local organizers of the Liberal party state that the entire matter will be left in the hands of the electors of Dorchester county.

## MESSAGE TO EASTERN ALLIES.

Canada's Greetings to Russians Whose New Year Began on Our Jan. 13.

Ottawa, Jan. 15.—On the occasion of the Greek Church New Year (Saturday) the government through the Governor General has sent messages to the kings of Montenegro, Serbia and Roumania and the Czar of Russia, expressing admiration for the great services they and their armies have rendered the allied cause, coupled with sympathy for the people who have suffered so nobly. The message also expressed the determination of Canada to continue until the common cause is vindicated and crowned with victory through an abiding peace.

Allies Take Action on Account to Prevent Hostile Submarine Bases.

Athens, Jan. 12, via London Jan. 15.

—The Allies occupied the island of Cerigo on Wednesday. Cerigo is the southernmost of the principal Ionian Islands, belonging to Greece. It is in the Mediterranean on the southern extremity of Moreau.
