WAR TIME RECIPES.

Snow Pudding.

One cupful water, 4 tablespoonfuls cornstarch, 4 tablespoonfuls sugar, the white of one egg and a half teaspoonful of vanilla. Dissolve the water and starch in a saucepan and then bring to a boil. Cook until clear, about five minutes, and remove from the fire.

Add the sugar, flavoring and stiffly beaten white of egg. Pour into cups that have been rinsed in cold water. Leave in cup until ready to serve.

Indian Meal Doughnuts.

Doughnuts can be made out of cornmeal, but some proportion of white flour is used.

Three-fourths of a cupful of milk, one and one-half cupfuls of fine white cornmeal, one and one-fourth cupfuls of wheat flour, one-fourth cupful of butter, three-fourths of a cupful of sugar, two eggs, well beaten, one teaspoonful of cinnamon, two teaspoonfuls of baking powder, one level teaspoonful of salt.

Put milk and meal into a double boiler and heat together for about ten minutes. Add the butter and sugar to the meal. Sift together the wheat flour, baking powder, cinnamon and salt. Add these and the eggs to the meal. Roll out on a well-floured board, cut in desired shapes, fry in deep fat, drain and roll in powdered sugar.

Baked Rice and Cheese.

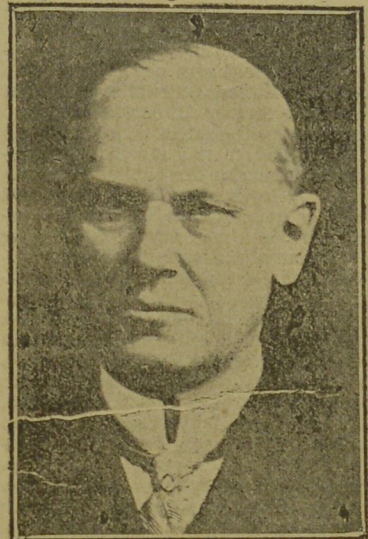
Three cupfuls of cooked rice, one cupful of milk, two tablespoonfuls of flour, one-half pound of cheese and one half teaspoonful of salt.

Make a sauce by thickening the milk with the flour, add the cheese and the salt. Into a well buttered baking dish put alternate layers of the cooked rice and the cheese sauce. Cover with but-

tered crumbs and bake until crumbs are brown.

SOAP SAVING IS NECESSARY.

Devices for soap saving are being brought to attention as a consequence of the advancing cost of soap due to fat scarcity. One of the simplest is a kind of wire basket on toilet stand or sink in which the soap is placed for use. The current of air striking up from below dries the soap after each wetting and prevents loss through dissolving of soap when the cake is allowed to stand in its own drippings.

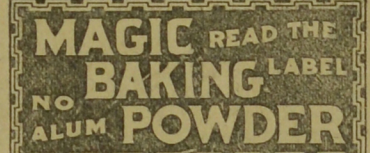

MERCHANTMEN
SUNK BY HUNS

London, Dec. 17.—One British and five neutral merchantmen, a British destroyer and four mine-sweepers have been sunk in the North Sea by German naval forces. The losses are the result of an attack on a convoy bound from Scotland to Norway, Sir Geddies, First Lord of the Admiralty, announced today. The total tonnage of the lost merchantment was 8,000.

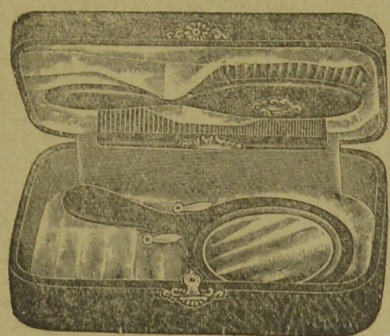
