THE NEW PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT HAS MADE A SPLENDID START

Premier Foster and his associates have done good work during their first session, and have done it under circumstances of uncommon difficulty. They found before them, when they took hold, a most unsatisfactory condition in every department of the public service, the result of years of reckless and partizan rule in which politics came first and the public interest last. Hon. Mr. Foster and his party have made an admirable start and the most difficult part of the journey is over. During the next stage they will be able to produce results based on the extensive re-organization and reformation they have set on foot. They have grappled courageously with conditions that were becoming intolerable, and there is at last in government circles a visible determination to give the people straightforward, honest, and progressive administration of their affairs. Considering the condition in which they found public business, this new government, confronted by a numerous and embittered opposition, has discharged its duties with uncommon merit and success. The task, of course is but begun. Its difficulties are not to be underestimated, for the affairs of the province after so long a period of neglect and worse than neglect are not to be placed on a proper footing in a day. But the government has shown that it has the will and the ability, and the outlook, therefore, is one that should be highly satisfactory to the taxpayers.

It is amusing to review, in the light of the session just closed, the various predictions made by the irresponsible newspapers of the old government just after the votes were counted and the success of the Foster party made

known. First it was said that the Murray-Baxter combination would not resign. They would meet the House and try to carry on. The verdict of the people was to be ignored. Mr. Foster, it was asserted couldn't form a ministry. He might not be given a chance to do so. And when he did so the same newspapers prophesied that when the House met the fierce and talented opposition would destroy the helpless government in less than a week. These and other wild predictions appeared foolish enough then; they appear still more foolish now. The opposition has been anxious enough to make trouble, but the ruling party held the whip hand with ease from the first. In the public view the old government party has been more and more discredited week by week, as proof of its conduct while in power has been recorded, in and outside the Legislature. And there is more to come. Not even yet is the full story told. It will be finished in due course.

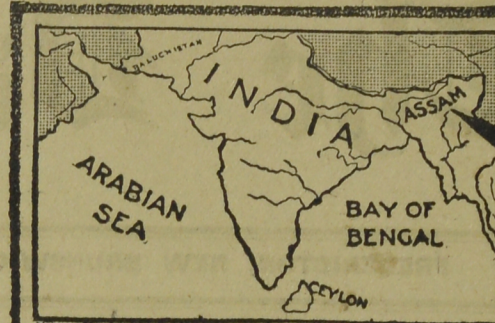

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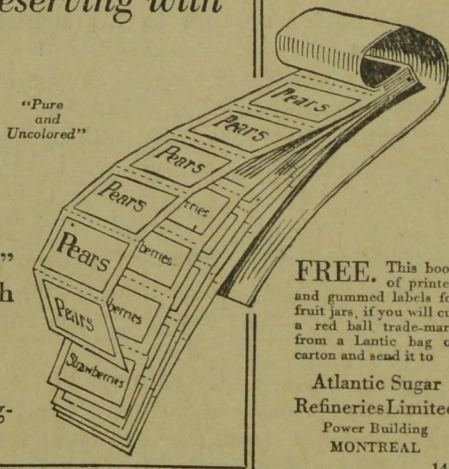

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In the Balance

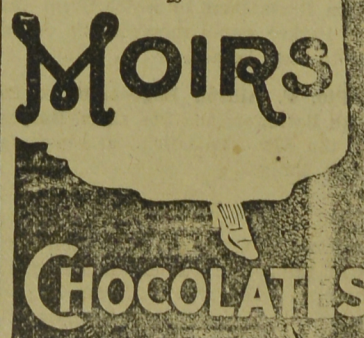
