SWEDISH GOVERNMENT TO MAINTAIN NEUTRALITY

The New Premier Issues an Important Statement--Will Strive to Prevent the Country From Becoming Involved in the World War--Personnel of Cabinet.

London, March 31.—Strict neutrality will be the policy of the new Swedish cabinet, according to a Stockholm despatch to Reuters. The new premier, Carl Swartz, has issued the following statement:

"In conformity with the principles laid down by His Majesty in charging me with the formation of a new ministry, the first duty of the government will be to follow fully the new policy of impartial neutrality which His Majesty and the former ministry successfully carried out. It is true that the difficulties have lately increased more and more, but the government regards such a policy as the surest means of finding a solution to such problems.

In striving to prevent the country from being involved in the world war, while fearlessly maintaining its inde-

pendence, the cabinet hopes to gain the support of the Riksdag and the Swedish people. Certain questions concerning the commercial policy of the country which are very important for the feeding of our people and for the maintenance of our industries will be the subjects of special consideration for the cabinet. Negotiations to this end will be begun immediately.

The members of the new cabinet are Admiral S. A. Lindman, foreign minister; M. Sternberg, minister of justice; Col. Akerman, minister of war; Capt. Hans Ericson, minister of marine; C. F. Von Sydow, minister of interior; M. Carleson, minister of finance; M. Hammarstrom, minister of instruction; M. Dahlberg, minister of agriculture; Hakon Ericson and M. Falk, ministers without portfolio.

SLIGHT REDUCTION IN PATRIOTIC FUND PAYMENTS

Statistics for March Show One Case Less in the Fredericton District.

The monthly statement for March furnished by Mr. R. H. Simonds, the secretary-treasurer of the Fredericton branch of the Canadian Patriotic Fund, and showing disbursements in the Fredericton District, shows a slight reduction in total expense, average expense and number of cases. In February the total number of cases was 322, the total expense \$4,791.50, and the average per family \$14.61.

POTATO PRICES HAVE HAD A SLUMP

Potatoes were a drug on the market today. Local dealers were offering \$4 and \$3.50 per barrel, but the farmers were not selling out at that price.

Small quantities sold for \$4.50 per barrel. There are no shipments now going out of Fredericton. In the United States people have refused to pay the high prices asked and are using substitutes for potatoes. Crops in the Southern States soon will be on the market, and the result will be lower prices.

The market is not expected again to reach the high price quoted this year, and farmers who did not sell at the top of the market are very regretful. There are many who held out for still higher prices.


